

Tartars Spoil Hallowe'en Party for Seahawks

'Tricks or Treats' was the genuine hallowe'en spirit at last Friday night's game, as the Seahawks were tricked, while the Tartars treated themselves to a 35-20 victory and also a tie for second place in the Bay Loop. The Seahawks took the ball on the opening kickoff and after not doing so well decided to punt, but much to their surprise Larry Roy managed to get his lanky frame in the way and Torrance recovered on the Redondo 10 yard line. An offside penalty moved the ball to the five where Jones, 'the human battering ram,' butted his way through for the first score. Roy converted and the score was 7-0, with only two minutes and thirty seconds gone in the first quarter.

Things looked good for the Tartars, but only a few plays later, Doug Dick, Redondo's mighty mite, took the ball sweeping around his own left end for about 40 yards and ended up in scoring position on the Torrance 12. Then Bob Weiss tossed one of his few com-

pleted passes to Bill Wayne for the score and Redondo was back in the game. Dick's conversion was bad and the Seahawks seemed to be behind the rest of the game.

On the next kickoff Jones returned the ball to the 42 where he and Bayliss teamed up to take the ball through the middle and around end till they reached the two yard line. Then Jones once more plowed through for the tally. Roy again converted with his educated toe and the score was 14 to 6.

The next time the Tartars got the ball Coach Graybuhl put Jimmy Farrar into the game. Farrar immediately tossed a beautiful pass to Roy who pulled a disappearing act and appeared again in the Redondo end zone for the third Torrance TD. He booted for the extra point and the half ended 21 to 6.

After the halftime intermission in which coach Graybuhl undoubtedly gave his warriors quite a pep talk, Joe Lafferty who played a good hard game all night, fumbled. Redondo recovering. After several attempted passes by Weiss, he booted to the Torrance 4 where Warren Stamps received and carried to the 8. A penalty forced the Tartars to punt and immediately Dick got into scoring position again until he went over for the tally. Bob Weiss's conversation was good and Redondo threatened once more.
