

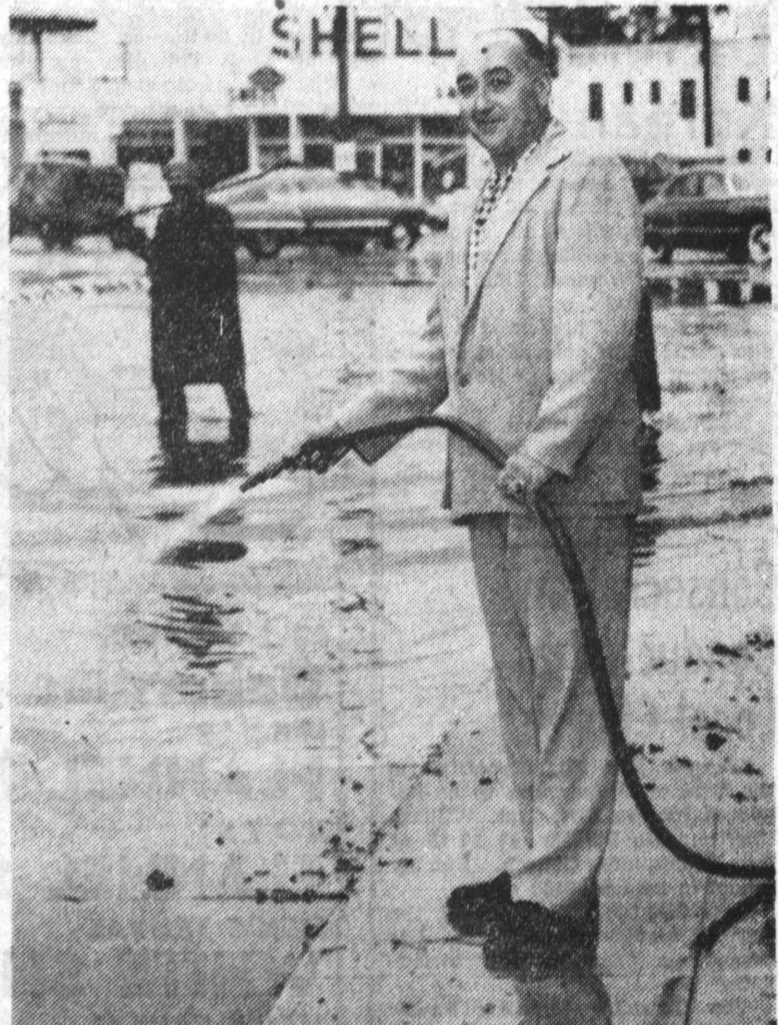
St. Catherine Parish Board Meeting Held
