Faculty Gets Pay Increase At El Camino

have been voted by the Board of Trustees for El Camino college faculty members, President Forrest G. Murdock said today.

The new pay schedule, Mr. Murdock said, establishes the faculty salary schedule for 1953-54 at a minimum of \$4,110 for a tenmonth pay period, and a maximum of \$6,710 on a 15-step schedule. Classified, that is non-teaching employees of the college, were granted increases of the same amount, Murdock said.

Incorporated in the basic salary schedule. Murdock said, was a \$360 cost-of-living bonus which was granted by the Board last year with an additional \$300 being added to each step of the schedule. Yearly increments in salary which automatically increase each year for instructors as their contracts are renewed, were maintained, he added. Increments amount to \$200 a year for the first seven steps in the schedule and \$100 a year for the remaining steps up to 15.




