**City Protests** Among those voicing vehement

protests last week against the granting of a permit to mine diatomaceous earth in Palos Verdes was the city of Torrance.

A request that Great Lakes Carbon corporation be denied to operate such a mine in Palos Verdes was submitted to the County Board of Supervisors by City Manager George Stevens, who also requested that the Walteria plant of the subsidiary Dicalite corporation be placed "under more strict control."

**Objections** Objections to the Palos Verdes project were based on these grounds:

1. Continual use of residential streets by heavily laden trucks. 2. Discharge of waste material

into a storm drain channel, thereby creating a nuisance and expense to the city to clean up. 3. Dust from the plant and trucks create a further nuisance. Last Thursday's hearing, which lasted a full day, heard the testi-mony mainly of those objecting

to such a plant. Attorneys William Kinley and Roland Swaffield spoke against the plant.

Dr. Frank Porter Miller, a chest disease specialist, claimed that diatomaceous earth "kills people." Attorney Leroy A. Garrett, representing the corporation, attempted to refute the physician by eating a chunk of the chalk-like substance. Eating
