Business firms can do their part by withholding all circular No More Than 20 Years

The best estimates they have been able to obtain through experts indicate that the Lompoc mine can remain active only for 20-30 more years, thus making the acquisition of a new site highly necessary because of the valuable and rare nature of the material, it was claimed. 
