Adamski's qualifications, frequently came into question by those who opposed his claims. His being self-schooled was not so much the issue as his having made no previous contributions in the field of science.

These, then are the contradictory claims which came to light in my investigation. A lot of people will continue to feel strongly one way or

the other about the matter and continue their heated verbal sword-play for some time to come. Others will look up from their work a moment, marvel at the fantastic century which gives rise to such claims, and then go right on about their daily business for the time being.


