

J. Frank Addresses Lions Club

J. Frank, president of Standard Broadcasting Company, addressed over 50 members of the Lions Club at a luncheon held Tuesday, January 5, at Alan Richard Hall, 1953 West Carson.

Frank, who spoke on a "New Declaration of Independence in 1954" stressed that "sovereignty in government rests with the individual" and that "government is what we make it."

The address was enthusiastically received by members of the club. It was considered to be one of the most inspired addresses they had ever heard.

'Unemployed' Seals Still Circulating

Over 13,500,000 unemployed Christmas Seals are still at large in Torrance and the rest of Los Angeles County. That was how Campaign Chairman Rod Maclean reported that the drive for \$650,000 in anti-TB funds was \$135,000 behind its goal at the beginning of the new year.

"These seals are unemployed," the Union Bank & Trust Company official explained, "because they are not doing the work they were cut out to do. The represent errent contributions which could bring funds up to this year's required minimum for a basic TB control program here."

"They will remain unemployed until we put them to work with contributions to prop up a program that even now stands in jeopardy. Aid to agencies and institutions which prevent and treat TB faces very serious curtailment in a county that saw over 500 lives lost to TB and 3000 new cases reported in 1953," Maclean noted.

He concluded with a plea that contributions be mailed to Christmas Seal Fund, Box 5735, Metropolitan Station, Los Angeles 55.

New Department B6-481, Started At No. American

Creation of a new department to operate the new inspection Test Laboratory now being built at Torrance B6 has been announced by T. E. Springer, vice-president-general manager of North American's El Segundo division.

Designated B6-481, the department has L. W. Dexter as administrator and R. Haack as department head of the new electrical and hydraulic labs, expected to be every bit as modern as the new inspection laboratory at El Segundo, are scheduled for completion in mid-1954.

ALIENS TO REPORT ADDRESSES

The Immigration and Nationality Act requires every alien who is in the United States on January first to report his address to the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization during the month of January, it was announced.

This is not the same thing as alien registration. The present address report must be made every year.

The report must be made by going to any United States Post Office or Immigration office and ask for an Alien Address Report Card. This is to be filled out and returned.

Further information can be obtained from any local office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, or the Central D.C.
