The couple left for a one-week honeymoon to Furnace Creek Inn, Death Valley.

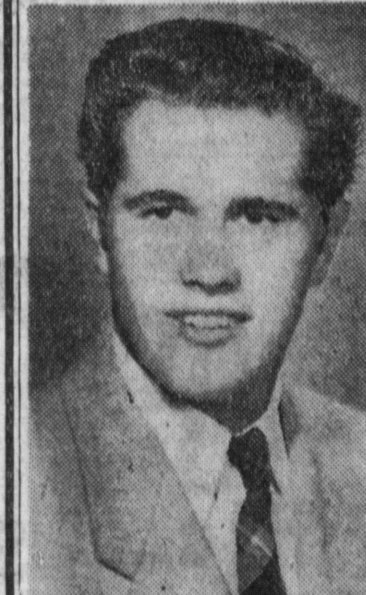
The bridegroom, a graduate of Torrance High School and a student at El Camino College, is working at the Torrance National Bank.

Tempers flared at the climax of the City Council meeting Tuesday over appointments to the Planning Commission.

Following unanimous agreement on the appointment of Hugh Sherfey, Mayor Mervin M. Schwab and Councilman Nicholas O. Dralle fell at odds over the second appointment when Mayor Schwab failed to

endorse Jim Minter, supposedly reversing a previous stand taken in an agenda meeting. The Mayor offered a petition signed by 137 residents favoring Bill Cameron, stating that he must go along with what the people want.

Minter's appointment was defeated 3-2, Councilman Victor Benstead siding with Councilman Dralle. No action was taken on Cameron.

Three Planning Commission seats are to be filled. They are being vacated by W. A. Felker, John Salm, and Tony DiMayle.
