Columbia Modernizes Production

Steel sheet manufacturing facilities that have far outlived their economic usefulness will be retired from service at the plant, Roach said.

Production in the obsolete sheet mill at the Torrance works of U. S. Steel's Columbia-Geneva Steel Division will be suspended at the end of April and steel output in the open hearth shop will be scheduled on reduced operations. About 400 employees will be affected, and every effort will be made to place as many of them as possible in other operations, according to Alden G. Roach, president of the division.

Closing of the sheet mill climaxes a program started early in 1953 for the gradual retirement from service of the time-worn sheet production lines at Torrance Works. The facilities have been maintained in operation far beyond their useful life in order to help provide steel products during World War II and more recently for the national defense effort during the fighting in Korea.

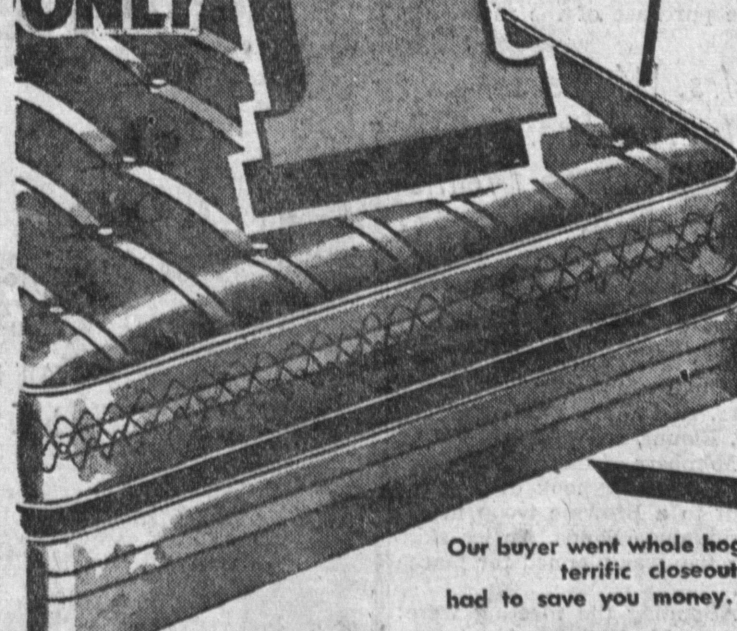
