

Anticipate Basketball League Tie

A tie for the Torrance Recreation Department's Tuesday Basketball League leadership looms on the horizon following last week's play on the Torrance High Court. Fenwick's Shoes maintained their first place standing by edging Banner Drugs, by a narrow 51-47 margin in the first game, and the Redondo Eagles did likewise by dumping Linch Auto Sales, 79-51 in the opening game.

The Eagles draw a forfeit win over Treske's Men's Shop next week, winding up league play with a nine won and one loss record. Fenwick's Shoes must dispose of Linch Auto Sales, at 8 p.m. next Tuesday, to retain their top position, in which event a one game play-off will be staged at 8 p.m. Tuesday, March 16.

The Tuesday League Champions will play the Wednesday League winners for the City Championship at 8 p.m. Wednesday, March 17. Immediately following the game, individual and team trophies will be presented to the respective winners.

Larry Gimenez, Fenwick guard, hit for 12 points to lead the victors' scoring attack. Guard Jerry Ott, of the losing Banner five, potted 14 for high scoring honors. Forward Mar. Dietrick aided the Eagles to victory with 19 big counters. Guard Danny Espinosa swished 17 for Linch Auto Sales.

Torrance High School Varsity team filled in for Treske's in the 8:05 p.m. game, and looked sharp in defeating the Big Five, 64-58 in the exhibition encounter.

Tartar forward, Jerry Farrar, led the hottest game of his career as he potted 12 field goals for 24 points, playing in only three quarters of the game. In fact the whole team were hot in the first half as they scored 24 points, going into the second period, before missing a shot from the field. Center Grant Harline and guards Earl Stark and John Brey were borrowed from the Redondo Eagles and mastered the Big Five with 22-17 and 10 points each respectively.

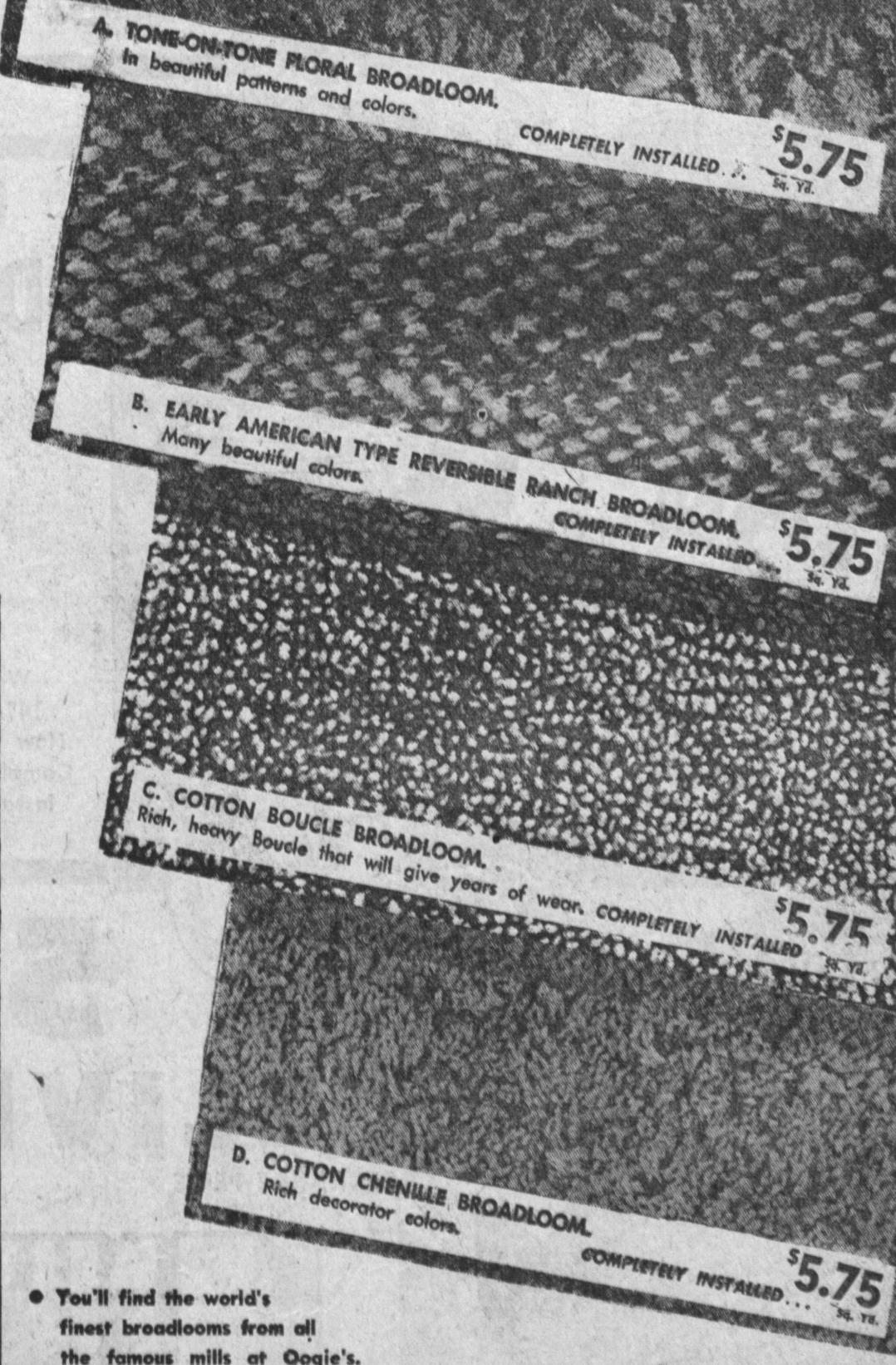
