## Crenshaw School Bids Awarded

Construction of Crenshaw Elementary School will begin Monday, March 22, and is to be completed within 210 days. Bid for the project was awarded to the Co-ordinated Construction Co., by the Board of Education Tuesday night. The bid was for \$339,700.

The school will contain three classroom wings with a total of 12 classrooms; a double classroom unit; a cafeteria; a music practice room; and an administrative unit, it was announced.

Funds for the particular project were made available by the federal government. Local residents and local industry were largely responsible for making this and other schools possible, because of their willingness to help the school district compile statistics needed to obtain federal funds. The school district can claim these federal funds by presenting evidence of parents employed in industries under government contract. Other schools which were ob-

## 2 File For School Board Election

Two candidates so far have indicated their intention to seek one of two seats on the Board of Education in the forthcoming school election set for May 21, it was announced this week.

Those who have filed their petition are Edward Schwartz and William Tolson.

The two seats which will become vacant are now occupied by William Tolson and Judge John Shidler, president of the Board.

Shidler had no definite statement to make at this time except to say that he was still "undecided" whether he would run again or not.

The last day to file for candidacy in the election is April 21. Candidates must be eligible voters in the precinct in which they live.

In order to vote in the forthcoming school election, residents must register with the registrars of voters located throughout the area or by coming to the City Hall by March 28.

The school board election is not to be confused with the City Council election which will be held April 13. Registration and filing dates for the municipal election are closed.

Absentee voters for the school election may procure their ballots between May 1-15, it was announced.

The school ballot will contain one amendment to the Torrance City Charter. The amendment, which is purely technical, clarifies the voting procedure. It calls for the election of Board members every two years for a four-year term as is presently the case.

## City Council Candidates States Views

With the April 13 municipal election coming up Robert F. Evans, one of seven candidates seeking one of two City Council posts, released the following statement concerning his position.

"My reason for running for the office of city councilman is that I was asked by a group of Torrance folks if I would run for Councilman and as I feel it is the duty of every citizen to contribute something to the betterment of his city I accepted this honor and plan to win this election."

"I will do everything within my power to keep Mayor Marvin Schwab in office as Mayor and will support him to the best of my ability. I believe we have one of the best school systems in the country and will cooperate with its governing body. I am proud of our Police and Fire Departments record and plan to do all I can to help them grow proportionate to the demand upon them."

"I name these only to mention a few."

"There are some departments that I believe to be very weak and I plan to do all I can to correct this situation. In the four years I have lived in Torrance our city has had good clean government and I plan to keep it that way."

"I stand entirely on my record as an active citizen in my community. I am a member of the Los Angeles Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America and chairman of Organization and Extension in the South Bay District. I am also a trustee of my church. I cooperate with the Little League Baseball Club of Torrance and assisted in the procurement of the land they are now using."
