Storm waters from the Palos Verdes Hills that flow through Lomita and Harbor City will be controlled through the drain, it was reported.

Route of the drain will be from the Torrance city boundary on the west along 246th street to Pennsylvania avenue and 246th street to 248th street to Lomita boulevard and along Lomita boulevard to the President avenue drain in Harbor

Low bidder on a contract for the construction of the Lomita Storm Drain was the A. Tiechert & Son company of Los Angeles with a bid of \$547,-298.04, considerably lower than unofficial estimates of \$950,000 for the project.

A total of 16 bids on the contract were opened.

H. E. Hedger, chief engineer for the Los Angeles **County Flood Control District** said the bids will be checked and submitted to the board of supervisors at its March 9 meeting for awarding of the contract.

Leonard L. Nichelson, son of Mr. and Mrs. I. O. Nichelson, 3331 W. 190th street, Torrance, was recently promoted to sergeant first class while serving with the 25th Infantry Division in Korea.

Rushed to Korea during the early days of the conflict, the 25th Infantry took part in some of the most bitter fighting on the peninsula. It is now undergoing intensive post-truce training.

Sergeant Nichelson, a platoon sergeant with the 35th Infantry Regiment's Company B, entered the Army in August 1952 and arrived overseas in January. He holds the Korean Service Ribbon with four campaign stars, Combat Infantryman Badge and and the UN Service Ribbon.
