FINCH FILES PAPERS

A winning campaign was promised voters of the seventeenth Congressional District by Robert H. "Bob" Finch, Inglewood attorney who polled more than 92,500 votes in 1952, as he filed nomination papers for Congress with Registrar of Voters Benjamin S. Hite.

Finch, a Marine Corps officer during both World War II and the Korean War, engaged incumbent Cecil King in a strong political battle in 1952 with a whirlwind campaign which forced King into his first runoff in all his years in Congress.

The officially endorsed candidates of the seventeenth Congressional District Republican fact finding committee, Finch also filed on the Democratic ticket for the June 8 primary. He is a partner in the law firm of Finch, Bell, Dultman & Jekel and a trustee of Palos Verdes College.

His political experience includes the office of Executive Secretary to Norris Poulson when the Los Angeles Mayor was representing California in the United States Congress; California Delegate to the 1948 National Republican Convention; and vice-chairman of the Los Angeles County Central Committee.
