At the climax of this contest, Torrance had dropped to second place, but were also a much wiser team.

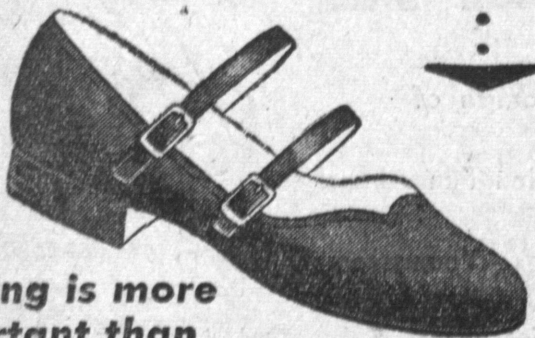
## B.P.W. To Initiate

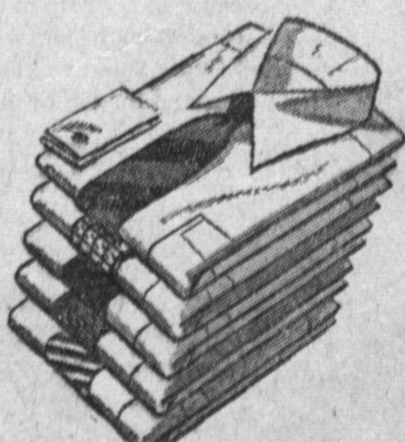
