**Intended to Resign**

Shidler said that he had informed the board for some time that he intended to resign, and asked that the board consider the choice of a successor. Since he did not wish to wait any longer, he asked the board to accept his resignation at this time.

Inasmuch as the board had no successor in mind, Shidler recommended Dr. Bay. The board found the recommendation acceptable and appointed Bay to the board, pending final confirmation by the County Superintendent.

Bay was born and raised in Torrance. He is an optometrist by profession with offices located at 1427 Marcelina. He lives at 2558 Torrance boulevard with his wife, Nadine, and his 19-month-old son, Alan.

Bay is a member of the Rotary Club, Jaycees, and active in senior scouting activities. During the war he was a chief pharmacist in the U.S. Navy for five years.

Tolson has filed to run again. Also running will be Edward Schwartz.

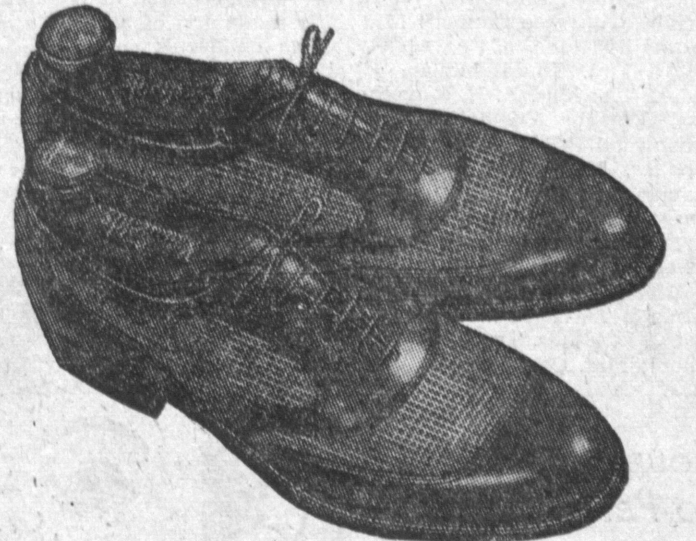

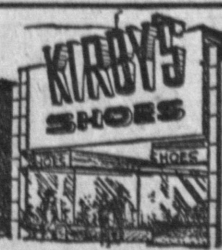
