"The people of the United States have gained more in individual civil rights under the eadership of the Eisenhower administration than in the previous 20 years of 'talk, but no action' Democratic administraions," Robert H. Finch, candidate for Congress in the 17th District, told the Torrance Republican Club Monday night.

Finch also criticized his own party for failing to spell out he advances that have been made since the 1952 elections, so that the general public failed to identify the Republican Party as the actual champions of civil rights.


The recreation department of Torrance is only sponsoring the club, the club itself is 100 per cent self supporting.
