Finch Cites Republican Contributions

"The people of the United States have gained more in individual civil rights under the leadership of the Eisenhower administration than in the previous 20 years of 'talk, but no action' Democratic administrations," Robert H. Finch, candidate for Congress in the 17th District, told the Torrance Republican Club Monday night.

Finch also criticized his own party for failing to spell out the advances that have been made since the 1952 elections, so that the general public failed to identify the Republican Party as the actual champions of civil rights.

Form Teen Aagers Club At McMaster

The purpose of the club is to instill in the minds of the teen-agers, responsibility, co-operation and to create their own social activities, according to Les Breitenfelt, park director.

Meetings will be held every Monday night at 7:30 at McMaster Recreation Building. Next meeting will be April 12. Rules and regulations were drawn up by the teen-agers as follows: A boy or girl must be 13 years of age and not over 15 years to become a member; when any boy or girl reaches the age of 16, he or she can no longer remain a member of the club, because of the limited space at McMasters Hall, only 100 members will be allowed at any one time. Membership cards are to be made out at a later date, and dues for the club is 50 cents every 6 months. Officers are elected every 6 months. As the club advances new rules will be added. There is a snack bar with hot dogs, cokes, candy and gum.

The recreation department of Torrance is only sponsoring the club, the club itself is 100 per cent self supporting.

Breitenfelt welcomes all parents to visit the club at any time and says he could use the assist-

ance of any of the parents. Barbara Billings a well qualified recreation workers is assisting Breitenfelt.

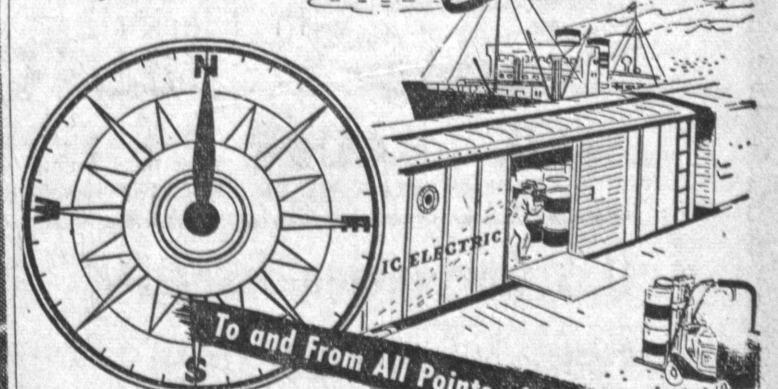

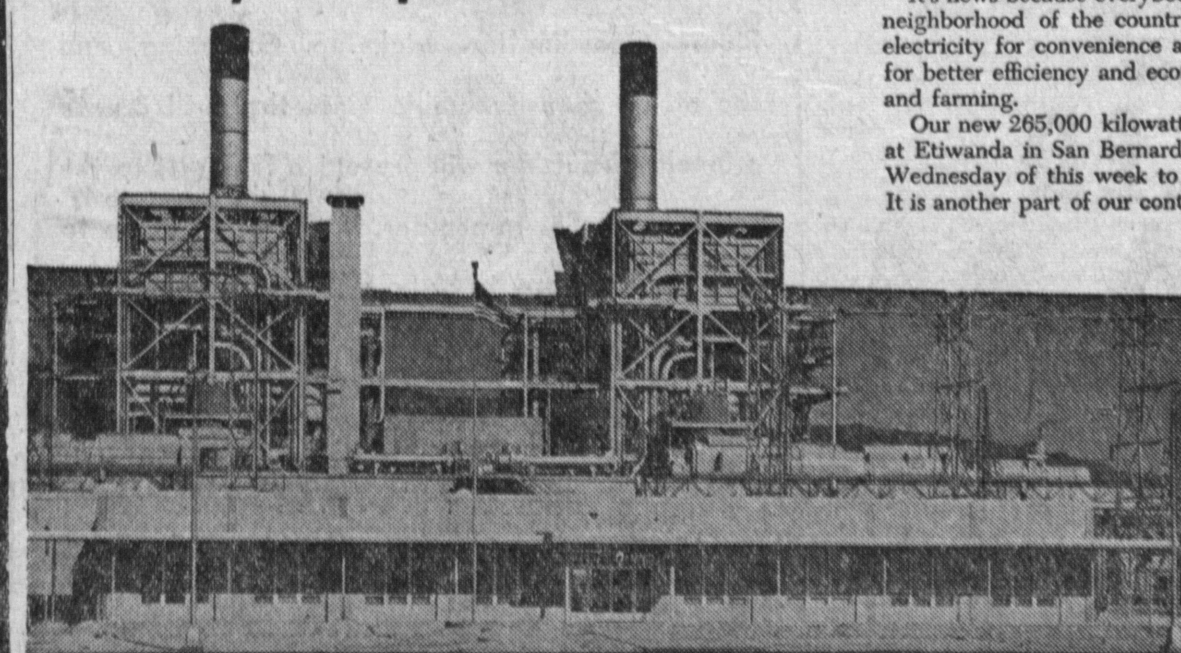
