2-Year-Old Boy Dying of Cancer

Little 2½-year-old "Chuck" Smith, who only recently had his right eye removed in a critical effort to halt the inroads of cancer, is now hopelessly dying of that disease.

"Our prayers for his life are ended. All we can do now is hope that he will not suffer," Mrs. Robert Smith, his mother, 3514 Cricklewood said this Monday.

Up till now the Smiths still hoped that Chuck's life could be prolonged or even saved. Blood tests Monday revealed that he had retina plasmoma, that is, cancer which has spread throughout the body including the blood and bone structure.

Staggering Bills
"We will have to sell our house in order to pay the medical bills," Mrs. Smith said. "We've already paid \$1000 and we still owe \$1000. Belonging to the middle income bracket we could not get help from any of the public agencies. But with the \$75 a week my husband makes you just can't pay such bills either. Our folks have moved in with us in order to make ends meet as much as possible."

Chuck was born with a cancerous condition but this was not discovered till he was two years old. He had his right eye removed in August of last year but the disease kept spreading. By January doctors still gave him a 50-50 chance to live.
