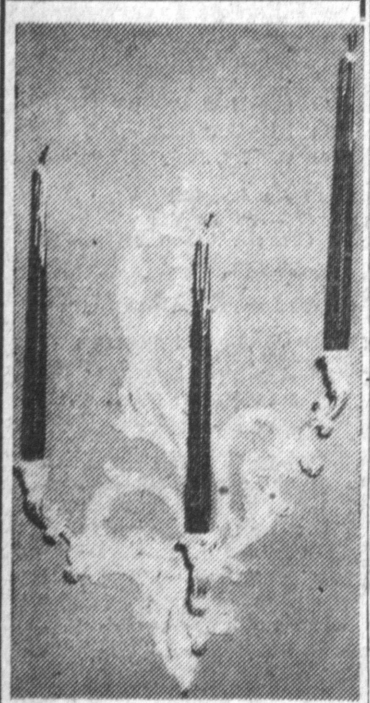


PLAN FAIR

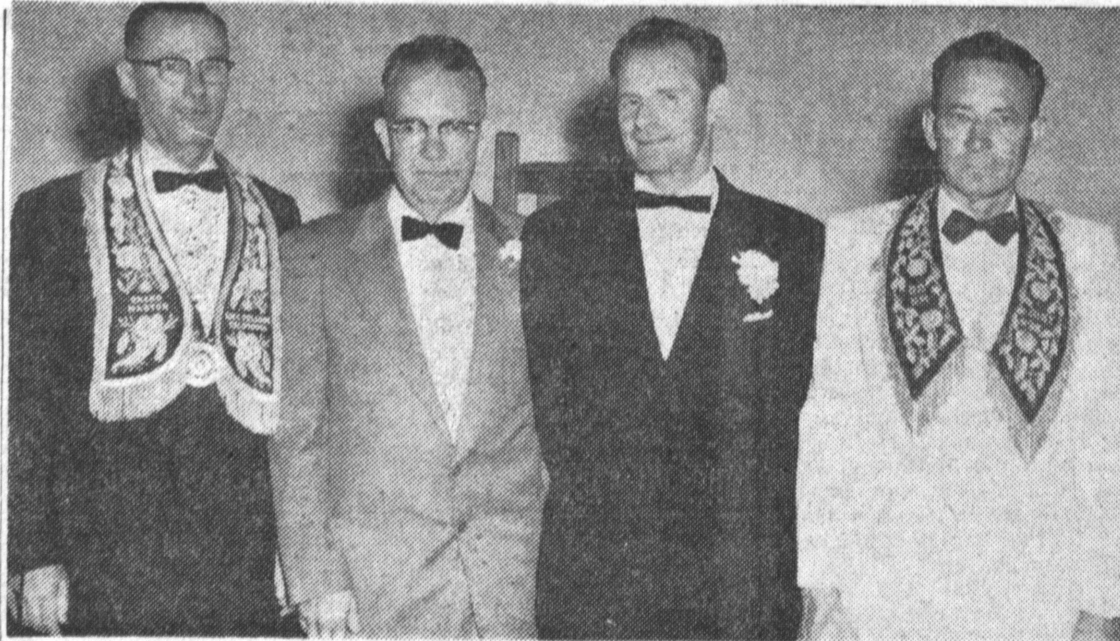

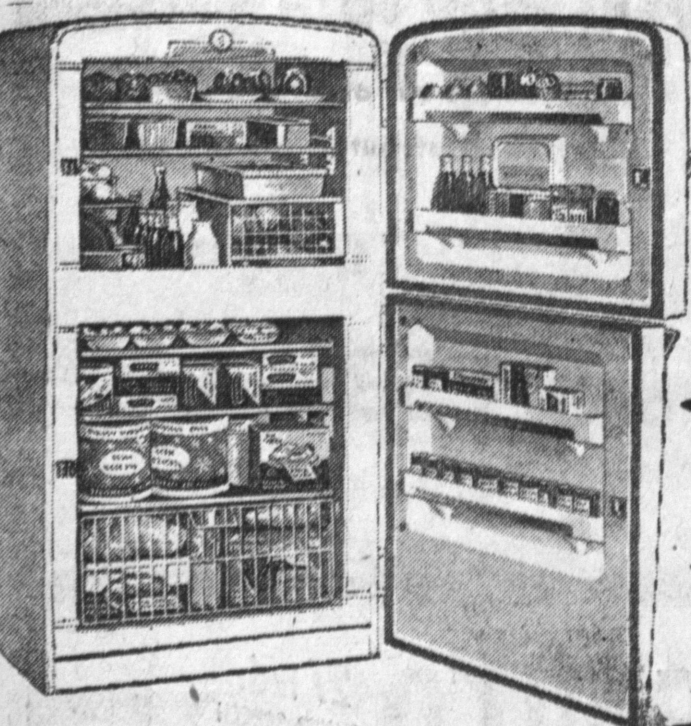
