

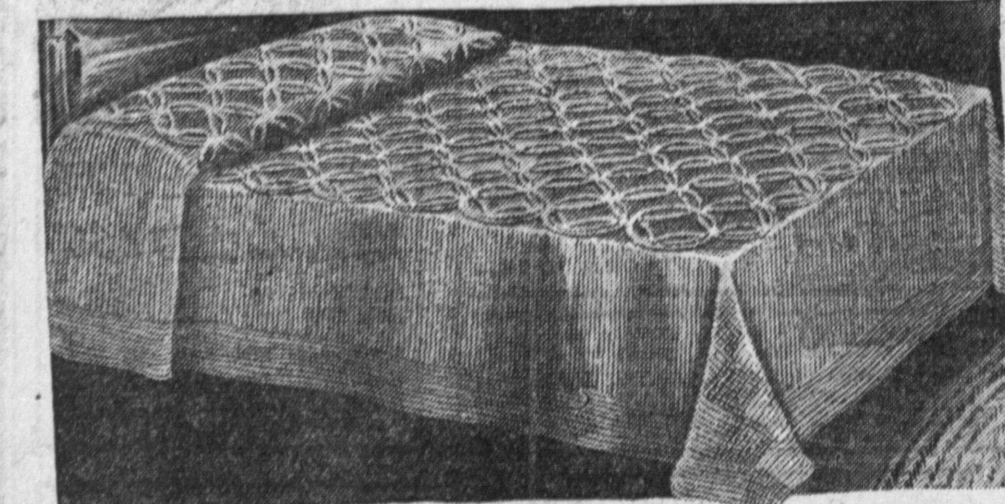

... seeks state senate post

Mrs. Frazer Given Demo Party Post



Mrs. Irene Frazer, long active in Democratic work in the Torrance area, was recently appointed campaign chairman of the Sixty-eighth assembly district for Richard Richards, it was announced.

In organizing the local campaign to elect Richards to the state senate, Mrs. Irene Frazer has appointed assistants in each of the local headquarters, made plans for a door-to-door campaign, and arranged speaking engagements for the Democratic candidate.

"Richards is the only endorsed Democratic candidate in the Thirty-eighth senatorial district, which contains 42 per cent of the voters of the state," Mrs. Frazer stated. Richards is one of seven candidates who have filed for state senatorship.

A Torrance speaking engagement for Richards is being planned some time during May, Mrs. Frazer stated.

Mrs. Frazer has served two years as secretary of the Torrance Democratic club and is presently secretary of the Democratic headquarters. She lives at 1559 West 210th street with her husband and three children.

Schlenker's Pigeon Wins First Race

The first race of the old bird season took place recently, from the 145 mile station Delano. The winning bird, a dark-checked hen, was flown by Chas Schlenker of Lomita. J. R. Richhart's blue barred hen won second. Mick Bogovich's dark checked cock won third.

The winning speed was 1253 yards per minute. The release time was 6:52 a.m., and the clocked time was 10:17 a.m. one hundred sixty birds participated.

Other birds that were within seconds of trapping at the same time as the third bird were owned by Bob Mitchell, the second by J. R. Richhart and the third by Dr. J. H. Hull.

One hundred and forty miles is considered to be a rather short race. The birds came bunched together and it was a trapping contest as well as a race. Anyone who had a bird who sat out on a pole or on top of a garage for a couple of minutes was out of luck.

The races each week end will be at successively longer distances working up to the 600 mile race from Kalamnouth Falls, which will end the season.

Next week's race will be from Tulare.
