## 70 MORE TEACHERS NEEDED

The Torrance Unified School District will need 70 more teachers in the coming school year, it was announced at the last meeting of the Board of Education.

The increase will cost a total of \$280,000 in salaries. It has been estimated that next year's school budget will total \$2,900,000 in comparison with the \$2,700,000 budget for this year. Increased funds through new assessed valuation are expected to total only \$170,000, it was estimated.

A comparative study has been made of teacher and administrative salaries. It was found that the \$38,000 starting salary for teachers here is about average. Administrative salaries are slightly below average. No increase in teacher salaries is anticipated during the next year. A study will be made of administrative salaries, it was disclosed.

# Zone Change Denied By Commission

Change of zone from singlefamily residential to multiplefamily residential in a tract at Ashley, Roslin, and Redondo Beach blvd. was recommended for denial by the Planning Commission last week, it was disclosed.

Jack Tomlinson, speaking in favor of the rezoning on behalf of his client, M. D. Shepherd, maintained that rental units are needed by the city and that the property in question is not being utilized at present except as a dumping area.

C. B. Weaver, 4240 W. 173rd st. represented the 72 property owners who have signed and presented the petition opposing this rezoning. Weaver stated that many of the veterans want to change their loans to the State G.I. loan. If these triplexes are built, the state will not make a loan on their homes.
