William Clarke reported that the organization has signed up ninety new members. The next

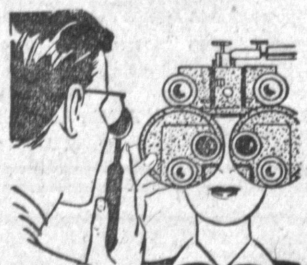

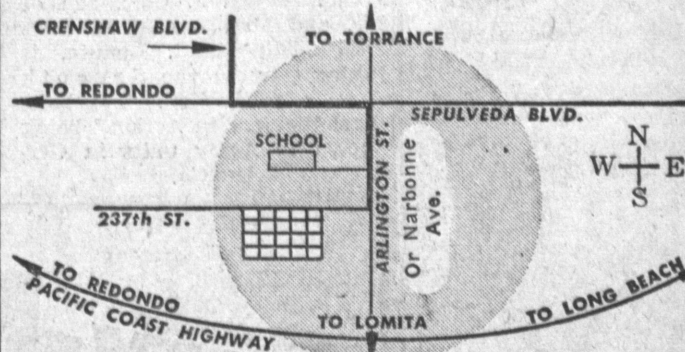

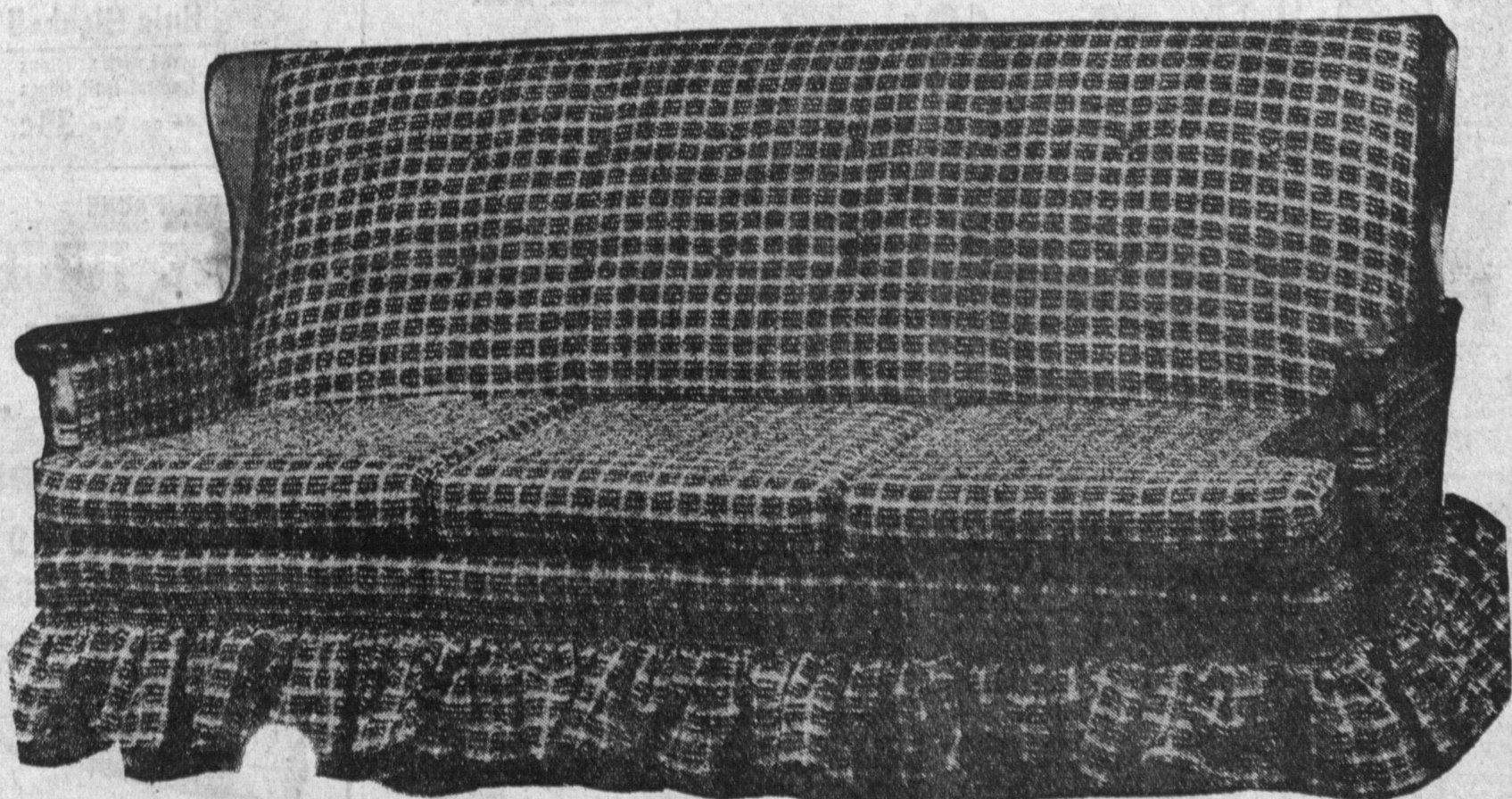
