- 1) Any bona fide non-profit association organized primarily for veterans' purposes or patriotic purposes or civic and charitable purposes may apply for sales permits;
- 2) The association must have

#### Dumping Hours

Anyone forgetting to have the garbage and rubbish ready on the pick-up days can take the refuse to the Torrance city dump located on Madrona north of Torrance boulevard. It is open seven days a week as follows: Mondays through Fridays 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

at least 35 adult members; 3) It must be a local organization, established at least two years;

4) Each permit will cost \$300;

5) Applications are to be made prior to the second Tuesday in March (except this year);

6) License are non-transferable;

7) Associations must take out a minimum public liability policy of \$50,000, holding the city of Torrance harmless;

8) Veterans should receive half of the licenses issued;

9) Licenses for stands are to be restricted to one per 4000 population;

10) No organization may take out more than three licenses;

11) No minors may work in stands;

12) Stands must be manned by voluntary labor (this was left open to discussion);

13) Within 60 days after July 4 organizations must file a sworn statement showing all receipts, expenditures, and net profits and duplicate invoices of all purchases; this must be on file to qualify for a license the following year.

#### Operate Own Stands

It was maintained that organizations can realize 50% profit from the sale of fireworks by operating their own concessions. A few stands operated by themselves can thus net them more money than a large chain of stands operated by a third party.

The council asked City Attorney James Hall to draw up a new ordinance along the above lines and present it at the next council meeting for action. The meeting will be held May 11 at 8 p.m. in the city hall.

There was no basic disagreement about the general provisions of the proposed ordinance among the councilmen. Councilman Willys Blount, however, took issue with Councilman

Albert Isen for not briefing the rest of the council on the proposed ordinance in advance. Isen replied that he had donated several hours to working out this ordinance and that he had done this for the benefit of both the council and all interested parties in order to expedite matters.

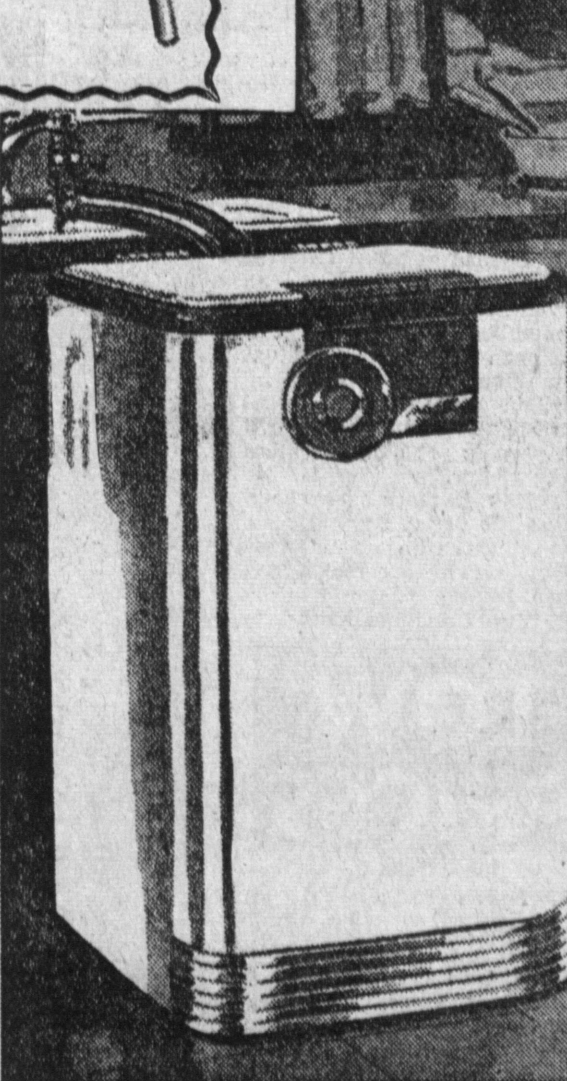

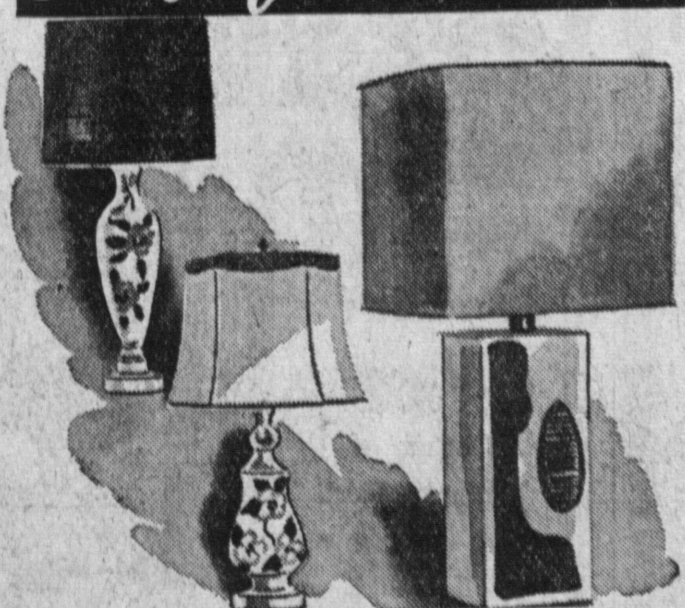
