with the city council or with the civil service board, Isen maintained.

The conflicting provisions of the civil service code and the board's findings and its recommendations are also responsible for the present controversy, Isen said.

In addition, the council approved another motion by Isen that the Civil Service Commission be cited to meet with the council to explain its findings in the case, Isen said. "Inconsistency" between the finding and the suspensions recommended by the commission needs explanation.

City Atty. James H. Hall said the council's action on Dresser was "definitely subject to challenge" and there is "grave doubt if the (Smith's) action can be sustained."


