

Work Permits Needed By All Minors

"All children who are working and are under 18 years old must have work permits in order to be legally employed," according to Lowell Fuller, work coordinator at Narbonne high school.

"This applies to all types of employment and also is true whether the minor is working during vacation from school or during a school day," Fuller said.

The labor law of California which protects minors is very specific and provides severe penalties for employers who employ young illegally and lack of a work permit is a direct violation of the law. Maximum penalties for employers range up to heavy fines and imprisonment.

Work permits can be obtained by the student from the high school which he attends. There is no charge made for this service.

P-TA Backs Juvenile Hall Bond Issue

"All P-TA members in Torrance have been alerted to the urgent need of a 'yes' vote on the juvenile hall bond issue appearing on the June 8 ballot," said Mrs. H. E. Carr, Torrance Council P-TA president. She

went on to state "P-TA members have been asked to spread the importance of voting for the passage of this issue among their friends and neighbors."

In a communication from Mrs. Walter E. Smith, first district P-TA president, it was explained that under present circumstances boys 16 to 18 years of age must be detained in County Jail due to the lack of sufficient space for this age group at Juvenile Hall. However the 1954 Grand Jury de-

mands that in compliance with state law these boys may not be held in prison unless the judge of the Juvenile Court advises that there is no suitable facility for them.

Mrs. Smith closed her communication in stressing that a two-thirds majority of votes is necessary to pass the bonds, and therefore a "yes" vote of all members in first district P-TA "is imperative for the
