Land Provided For Proposed Scout Center

The Torrance Scout Center group was definitely assured a location on Plaza del Amo next to the YWCA after the YWCA amended its lease boundaries for that purpose this week. This enabled the city council to lease the plot of ground to the scout center.

Plans for the proposed \$32,000 to \$35,000 building have been drawn free of charge by an architect and a lease has been secured from the city for the site, according to Mrs. Robert Mowry, secretary of the Torrance Scout Center organization.

The organization hopes that sufficient labor and materials will be donated to make the Scout Center a reality for the more than 4500 people who are connected with Scouting in the local area.

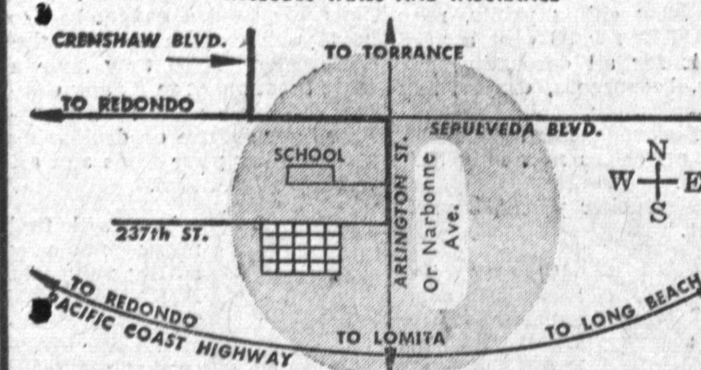
