Relief Promised From Fly Menace

A representative for two North Torrance dairies, city officials, and health department officials assured homeowners protesting the fly-menace in North Torrance that health regulations would be strictly enforced.

This action resulted when homeowners appeared before the city council last week to protest the fly condition in North Torrance.

The fight to get the fly-invasion cleaned up was led by R. V. Perrin, 2421 W. 171st street, who spoke on behalf of the

other residents in his tract.

Perrin said that since newspaper publicity was given to their area, attempts have been made to correct the conditions, especially within the last few days.

A report to the city from the L. A. county department of health stated that an excess of flies, apparently due to a lack of spraying, was revealed on the Ormonde dairy farm.

The farm was notified that it must spray more often.

Negative must be included with any picture that measures under 5 by 7 inches.

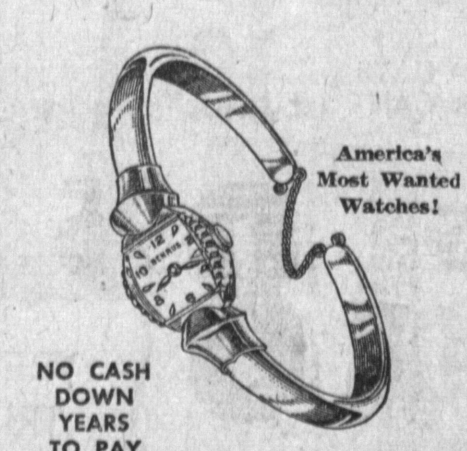
Pictures and negatives will be held in the Press office for the duration of the contest, at the end of which owners may claim them here. No pictures will be returned by mail.

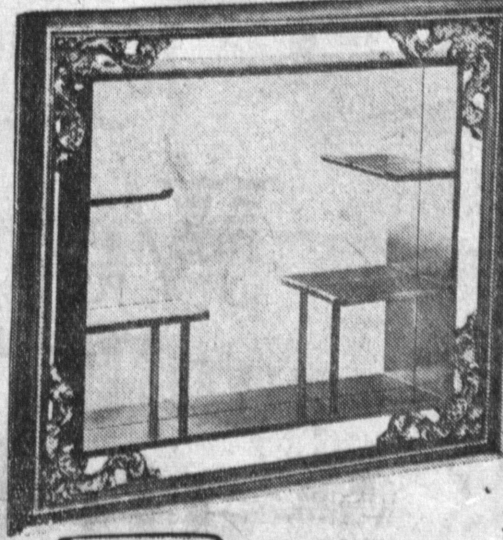

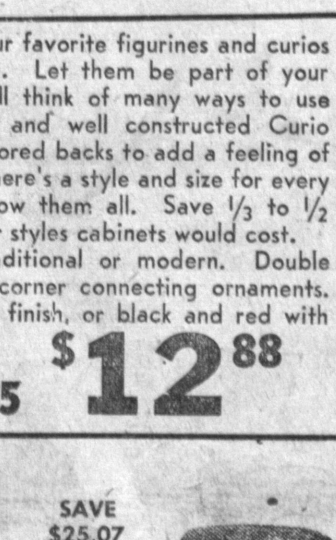

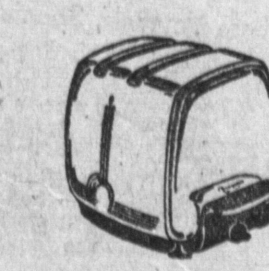
