Lead Graves on the Republican  
ballot, 4653 to 349.

**Congressional**

In the 17th Congressional district,  
Cecil R. King (D) lead  
Robert H. Finch (R) 6284 to  
1323 on the Democratic ballot.  
The Republicans gave Finch  
the go-ahead in a vote of 3711  
to 1009.

Election returns from the  
Registrar of Voters at press  
time indicated that King,  
Finch, Thomas, and Willd will  
contend in the November  
race. The following figures  
were released:

17th Congressional district:  
(683 out of 867 precincts)  
King . . . . . 41,494 7,260  
Finch . . . . . 8,816 23,825  
68th Assembly District  
(246 out of 249)  
Thomas . . . . . 14,168 2,905  
Rawls . . . . . 2,386  
Willd . . . . . 791 4,286

In the 68th Assembly district,  
Vincent Thomas (D) lead with  
a 5320 vote on the Democratic  
ticket. John T. Rawls (D) mustered  
845 votes and John A.  
Willd (R) received 388.

On the Republican ballot,  
Willd received 2218 to Thomas'  
1074 votes.

**103 Precincts**

A total of 13,755 votes were  
cast within the 103 precincts.  
The precincts broke down as  
follows: 66 Torrance; 6 Key-  
stone; 16 Lomita; 5 Rolling  
Hills; 1 Victor; 9 Los Angeles  
City; 1 Keystone-L.A. city.

In order to appear on the No-  
vember ballot, candidates in the  
17th Congressional district  
must capture a majority of the  
votes cast by their respective  
parties in 867 precincts. Can-  
didates in the 68th Assembly dis-  
trict must capture their party's  
majority vote out of 249 pre-  
cincts.
