Where the health and safety of the community is concerned, as it is in the matter of hospital facilities, it is not a partisan matter and selfish interest should be set aside...

quired to meet the State Health Department standards. The cost will be approximately \$375,000 and the financing will be handled as heretofore by the Hospital Board.

The old Christian Church building adjoining the hospital which was constructed before the days of building restrictions, has been carefully studied by the Hospital Board and the hospital architect, and it is impossible to make it conform to the standards set up by the Bureau of Hospitals of the Department of Health of the State of California in regard to hospital and is in no way qualified for present or future hospital needs.

Under the terms of the Jared Sidney Torrance Trust, hospital expansion is entirely a function and a responsibility of the board and not of the Hospital Staff.

The proposed hospital expansion provides for the additional number of parking spaces as required by the city ordinance.

There is no reason to believe that the proposed hospital expansion will be other than an artistic building, and it is favored by a large majority of the affected property owners on both sides of the street in front of the hospital.

In regard to future needs, it is realized a hospital of 99 beds is inadequate to serve this entire community, and your attention is called to the fact that members of the medical profession have started proceedings to form a hospital district and to erect a hospital centrally

located between Torrance and the beach cities.
This movement was started well over two years ago and it will be three to five more years, if not longer, before it materializes. An adequate hospital of this type will cost about four million dollars...
Based on present and expected growth, by the time it is possible to erect a larger hospital, this southwest area will need both the expanded Torrance hospital and the new one...
It was decided that... the health needs of the community would be benefited more by investment in hospital facilities and equipment used directly in the care of patients than by investment in additional ground, namely the Christian church lot...
It should be mentioned that the labor and delivery rooms are at present in the same wing with the operating rooms, and the hospital has been ordered by the State Health Department to remove them from this location...
The request for variance made through the usual channels by the Hospital Board in order to begin construction of the additions provides for extending the two wings closer to the front property line than average. Application for a variance is a normal, frequent, and proper procedure.

After two hearings and a thorough investigation the Torrance City Planning Commission recommended this variance.

It is hoped that these pertinent facts will bring support to the efforts of Torrance Memorial Hospital Board in securing the necessary variance for these badly needed additional hospital facilities.
