3-YEAR-OLD DOG-BITE VICTIM FACES SHOTS

Three-year-old Billy Britt of 2116 Gramercy ave. continued with his painful Pasteur treatment this week because the savage dog which bit him on the lip could not be captured despite a widespread newspaper appeal issued last week. Billy is facing the prospect of 11 more agonizing anti-rabies shots bravely, according to his parents. He was given three such shots last week already, following the bite. The injections are applied to the sensitive abdominal region. The after-effects are extremely painful, causing severe stomach cramps. The Pasteur treatment is the only safeguard against rabies which is always fatal if not caught in time. Los Angeles and Torrance have discussed a compulsory anti-rabies vaccination law for dogs which is the only sure-fire protection against the outbreak of rabies. Los Angeles is stalling with its ordinance. The Torrance city council has only given "unofficial" attention to such an ordinance.
