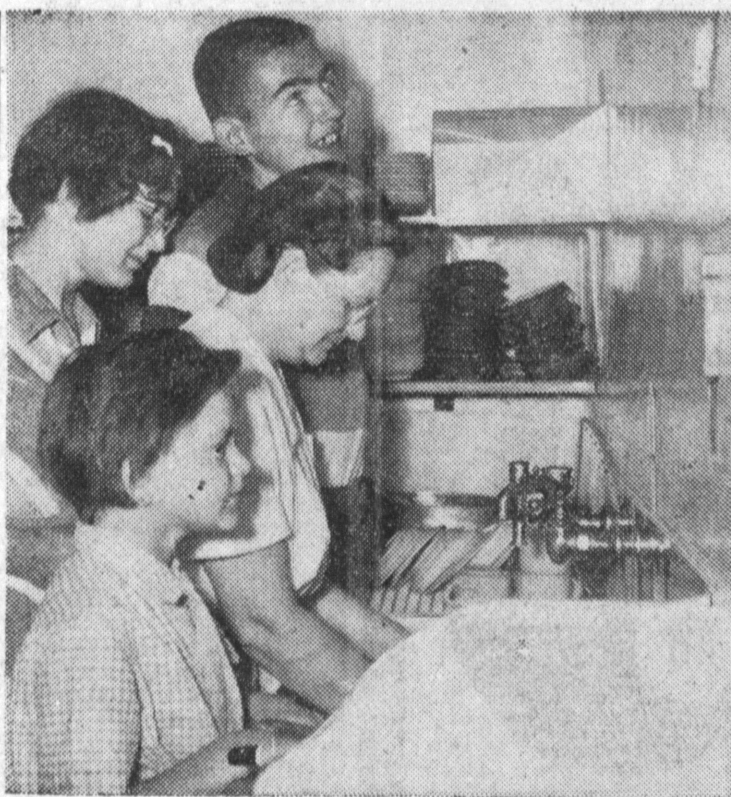

Destitute Mom, Kids Run From Years Of Brutality

People move to a new city for many reasons. But sometimes they run away from the past. Sometimes they run away from 17 years of brutality.

That is why Mrs. Marie Colstad and her three children came to Torrance about one week ago. They had no particular reason to choose Torrance except that it was as far away as possible from the area around San Bernardino where they had come from and as far as they could go before their money ran out.

The Colstad story is one of brutal and incessant beatings, promises, and more beatings at the hands of a tyrannical father and husband.

When Mrs. Colstad and the children reached Dotty's Cafe at 1550 West Carson Mrs. Colstad pleaded for a job.

Destitute
"She's the best worker I ever saw," Mrs. Dorothy Hill, owner of the restaurant said. "I took her in. She is living and working here but their living quarters are totally inadequate. They're staying in back in a place that's just about the size of one room. They are really destitute. The woman had only one dress. The kids need shoes. They came with practically

At a dinner-dance installation held at the Hollywood Riviera nothing. They need everything. I wish we could find some clothing for them and low-cost living quarters, about \$30 or \$40 a month. She can pay that. She's going to work at my place permanently."

Mrs. Colstad is still a young woman in her thirties but the horrors of the past have aged her features. Her son, Walter, 15, is looking for odd jobs to help support the family. The other children are Juanita, 14, and Theodora, 9. "There are many people who will love to help you and the children get a new start in life," Mrs. Hill told the woman. "But they must know about you. That's why I called the newspaper."

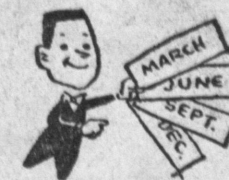

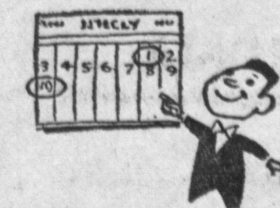

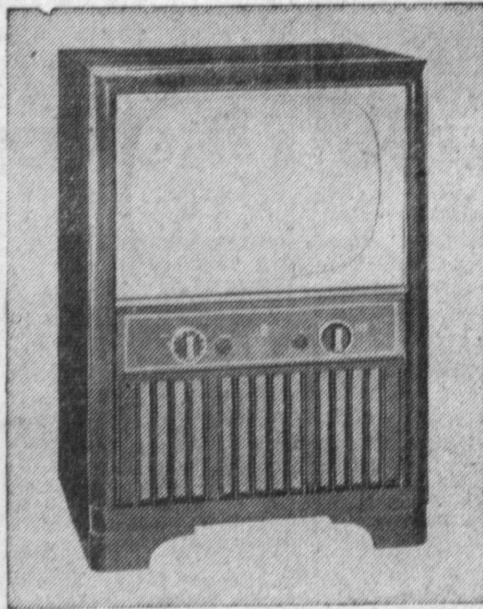
