CARSON HEARING JULY 29

Public hearings on creation of a master zoning plan for the Carson District will be held July 29, the county supervisor decided.

Establishment of 10 different land uses for the 4.5 square mile area is called for in the comprehensive plan.

The area is bounded by Del Amo boulevard, the Dominguez Channel, Lomita boulevard, the east line of Normandie avenue, and a line half way between Avalon boulevard, and Bonita street.

The zoning districts of Avalon-Sepulveda and Harbor City form a portion of the southeast boundary.

Street Signs To Be Brought Up To Date

The city council recently asked that the population figure on Torrance city limit signs be brought up to date and changed from 22,000 to 50,000.

In order that this can be done, the chamber of commerce explained, the city must issue the purchase order and submit a certified copy of the last special census figure to the American automobile association, who in turn will have the new signs made.
