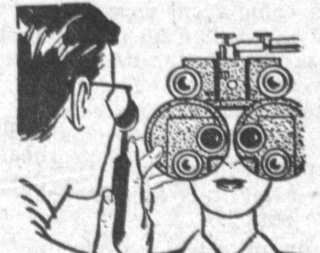

Gentlemen:

This organization strongly favors good public recreation program for our citizens, the best obtainable within existing economics, modern engineering and suitable to the physical character and pattern of our community's development.

Nature has provided Torrance with a beach and shoreline that compares with others of international repute, but due to lack of funds there has been little or no improvements initiated to keep the beach in line with other developments brought about by its unprecedented population growth.

Therefore, it is essential that a program be immediately initiated, followed up to properly present competent effective pressures to secure allocations from impounded tideland funds to insure development action. This move is intelligently supported by organized efforts of civic minded taxpayers and those interested in the continued widespread orderly development of the entire area.

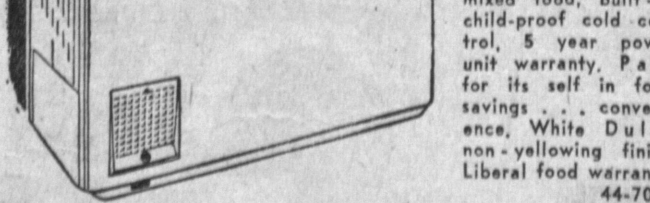
