that the actual owner must ask for a variance. Stearns questioned the Planning Commission's abilities to carry out its duties, stating that the members showed a "reckless disregard" of the zoning laws passed by the City Council. No special circumstances existed to merit a variance in the present case, Stearns declared. He represented Earl Miller and Harry Massie, near-by residential property owners. Halverson countered Stearns' arguments by attempting to show where Stearns contradicted himself. Halverson also pointed out that this country was founded on the principle of free enterprise, so that no one individual or group of individuals should have a monopoly. Isen Defeated

Councilman Isen tried to cut off all further discussion of the matter as soon as Stearns had finished when he moved that the issue be referred to the city attorney for his written legal opinion. The move died for lack of a second.

After the heading on the mortuary was closed, Isen once more made the same proposal. The move died again for lack of a second. Thereupon the councilman proposed that the matter be tabled until the council study the desirability of the mortuary site and other downtown sites for parking purposes. This move, too, died for lack of a second. The council then took its 4 to 1 vote, without uttering another word on the matter.

a bayonet, and exchanged words with bystanders. He then kicked over a portion of the reconstructed barricade.

About this time, three Torrance and three Redondo police cars arrived, stopped the fight and ordered residents to remove the barricade. Some 60 to 70 people gathered to participate and watch the events.

After tempers had cooled, Caldwell and his former opponents were shaking hands.

Redondo residents said that they objected to the cars speeding past their homes. There are no sidewalks in the area, and residents said they feared for their children. There are no speed limits posted in the area.

After leaving Torrance, the street goes through a 150-foot strip of Redondo Beach territory and then enters Los Angeles county jurisdiction.
