Blimp Tours Scheduled At Airport

Blimp tours of the harbor are now being scheduled with Torrance Municipal Airport serving as the point of landing and departure, it was announced this week by Ed Dietrich, manager of the field.

The craft, operated by the Goodyear Aircraft Corp., plans to make flights from the field each Sunday after a series of test hops here this week.

R. H. Hobensack, in charge of the service for Goodyear, said the blimp will be at the field from about 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. each Sunday. It is based at Rosemead Airport during the week.

It will land and take off from the extreme west end of the main taxi-way, where it will not interfere with airplane traffic, according to Dietrich.

The non-rigid craft has an envelope which contains 123,000 cubic feet of helium, a non-inflammable gas. The envelope is made of two-play rubberized nylon, which Hobensack said is lighter and stronger than the three-play rubberized cotton formerly used. It is propelled by two 145-horsepower engines attached to the gondola which carries six passengers and a pilot.

The Enterprise is an L-type blimp, smallest of seven types built by Goodyear and used by the Navy for Anti-submarine patrols during World War II.
