(Continued from Page 1) dren, into a recreational area that will be a civic asset for the entire community, Chace said.

The Fourth District Supervisor said that final information for the plans and specifications to construct the drain had been received July 23 at the office of H. E. Hedger, chief engineer of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, from the Los Angeles City Engineer's office.

Route of the drain will run from the southeasterly arm of the slough near Anaheim and I streets to the West Basin's northernmost extension near Wilmington and San Pedro road at the Downing street intersection.

Construction will consist of a weir at the Bixby Slough end of the drain to maintain a constant water level in the slough, and more than 4000 feet of reinforced concrete box drain ranging from 10 to 13 feet in width and 8 to 11 feet in height, Chace said.

In addition, two short sections of drain will be installed under the Pacific Coast highway east of Dodge avenue and beneath Lomita boulevard near the Dodge intersection to provide better drainage in the area east of Vermont avenue, Chace said.

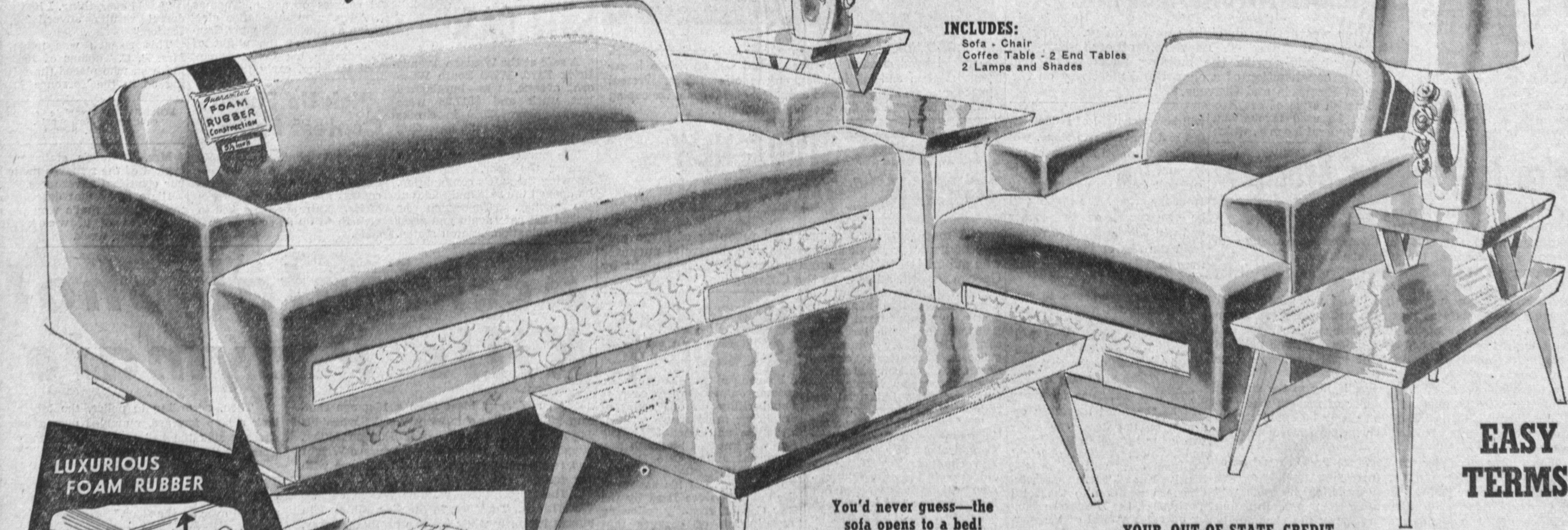
