Children from the various recreation centers will come dressed as the different types of animals.

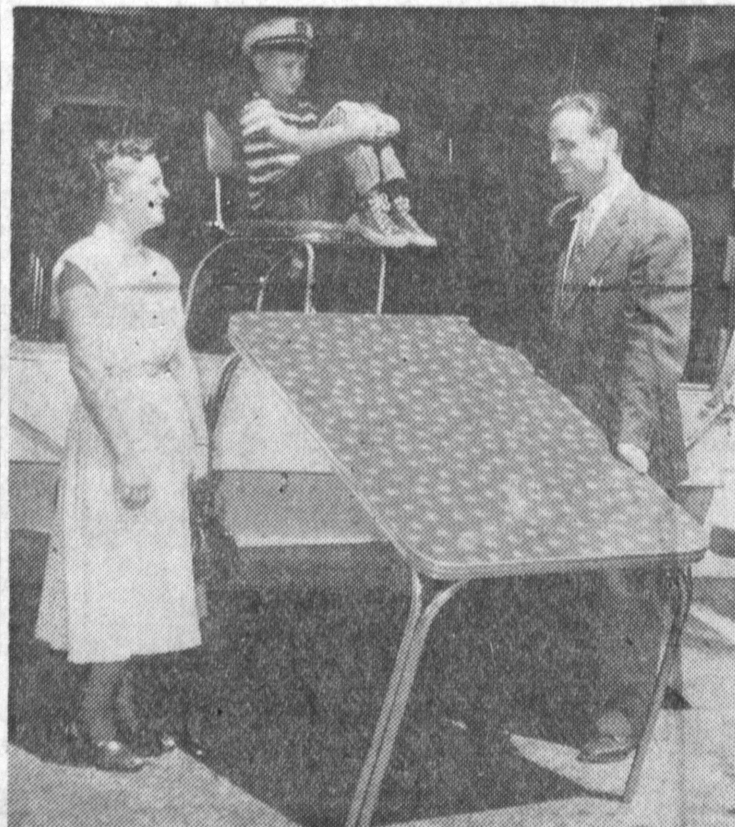

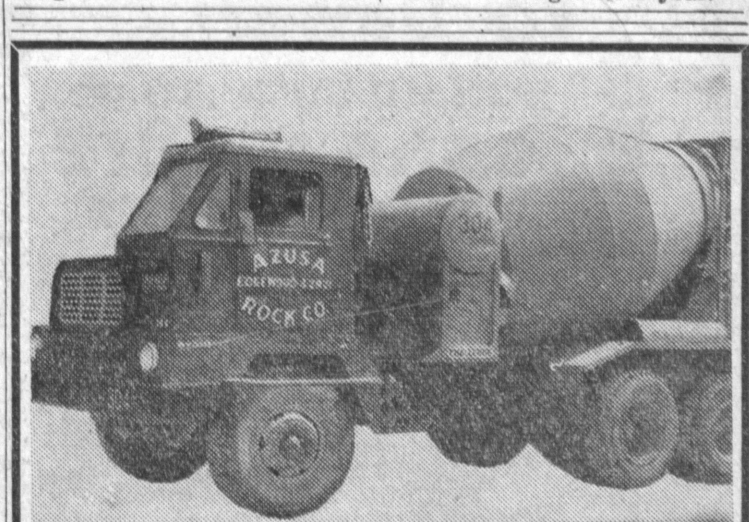
Torrance Girls

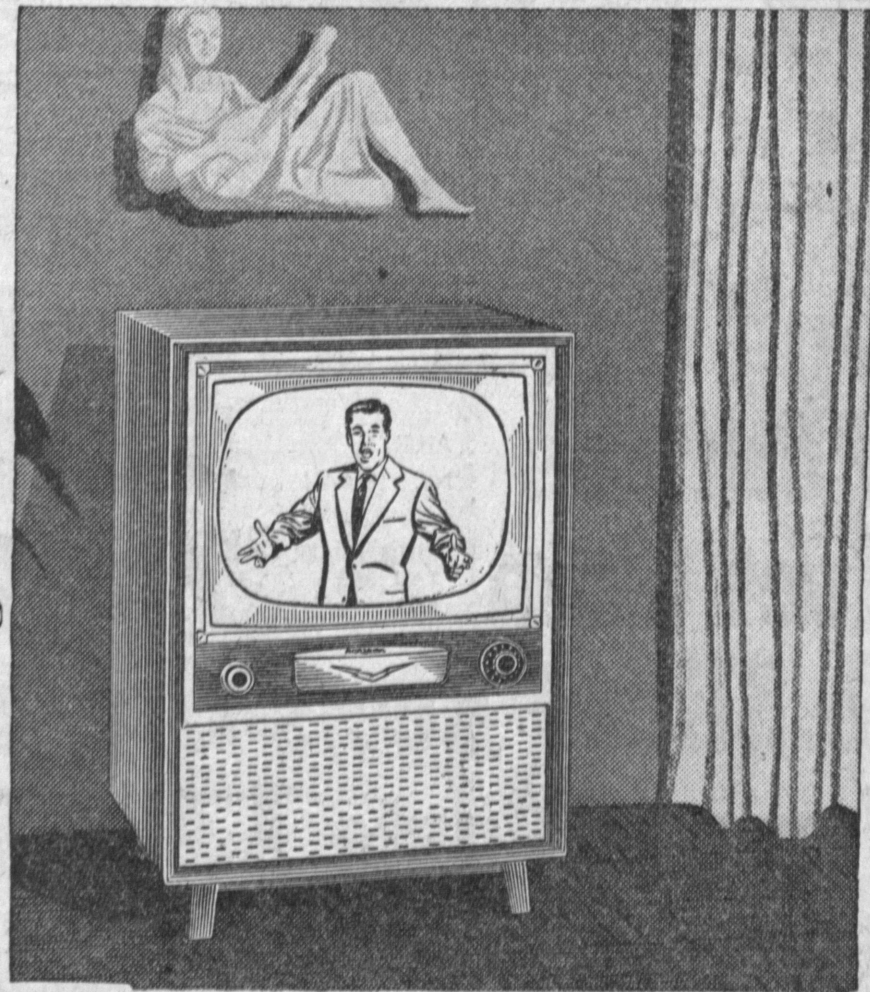
