

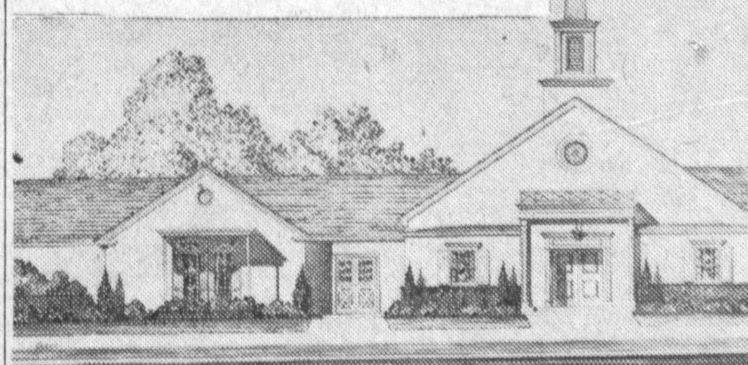
Methodist Brunch Club Officers Hold Breakfast

Nazarene Church Breaks Ground On \$35,000 Church

More than 200 members of the Church of the Nazarene, 1501 West Carson st., attended the ground-breaking services Sunday for their new church to be located at Carson st. and Denker ave.

Dr. R. J. Plumb, district superintendent of the Southern California District of the Church of the Nazarene was the main speaker. Other church leaders present included Rev. Arthur Bello, president of the Torrance Ministerial Association, and Rev. Freeman A. Brunson, pastor of the Church of the Nazarene.

Plans drawn by Gamble and Associates of Long Beach, include a beautiful Colonial type sanctuary 42'x110', with seating capacity for 352, two choir rooms, choir of 30, nursery, baptistry, and pastor's study.

Roscoe Abbe of Alhambra is the contractor for the \$35,000 edifice, a great part of the labor being donated by church members.

Lt. Hammer With 452nd Air Wing At Long Beach

Attending a fifteen day tour of active duty at the Long Beach Air Force Base with the 452nd Tactical Reconnaissance Wing (Reserve) is Lt. Arno R. S. Hammer, who resides at 1630 Post Ave., Torrance. The 452nd gained fame in the Korean conflict as a light bombardment wing winning the Korean Presidential Citation. The wing was the first Air Force Reserve unit called to active duty and to see action in Korea.
