

Rep. King Calls 'Red' Bill 'Weak'

Congressman Cecil R. King, who led the way for passage of national legislation to outlaw communism as author of the first such bill (H.R. 5941) in the House of Representatives a year ago, declared today that "while the recent action of Congress makes the road rougher for Communists, it was unfortunate that the Republican Administration insisted on removal from the bill of the provision which would have made membership in the Communist Party a crime."
