

## City Chairmen Honored At Polio Parley

At a dinner held at the famous Kenny polio hospital in El Monte last Tuesday, August 24, to honor all city chairmen, Mrs. Harold Osborne of 3026 Torrance boulevard, Torrance's city chairman, announced that \$1,334.23 was raised by her workers for the recent Sister Kenny fund raising appeal.

she concluded.

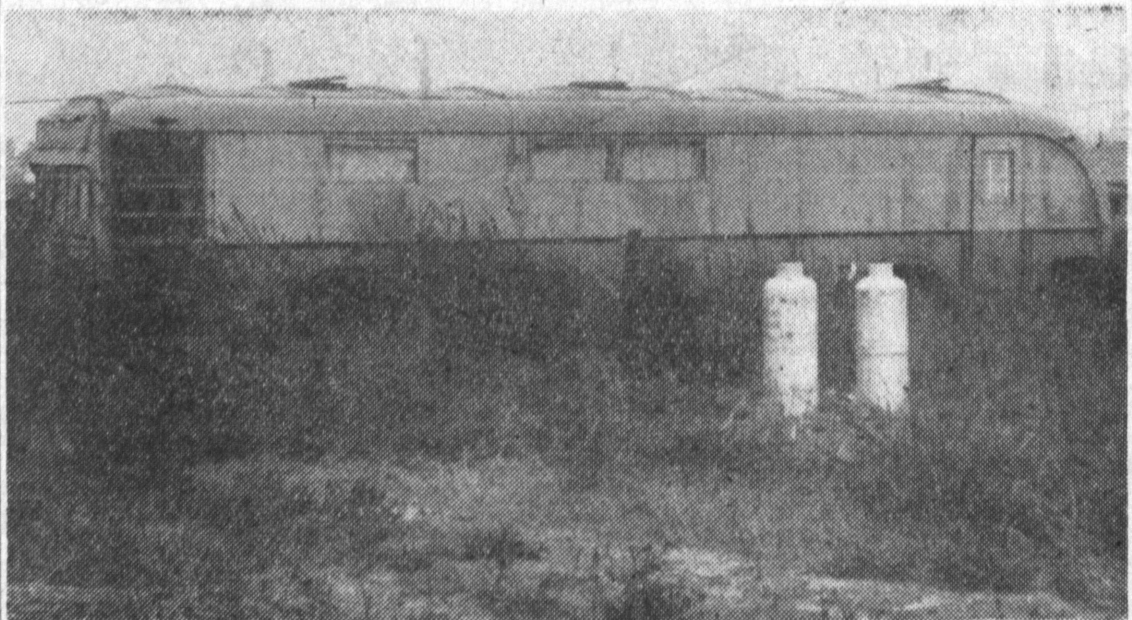
The hospital is the only one in the entire west to give the complete Kenny Method of care for polio and is open to all regardless of race, religion, residence, age, color or ability to pay.

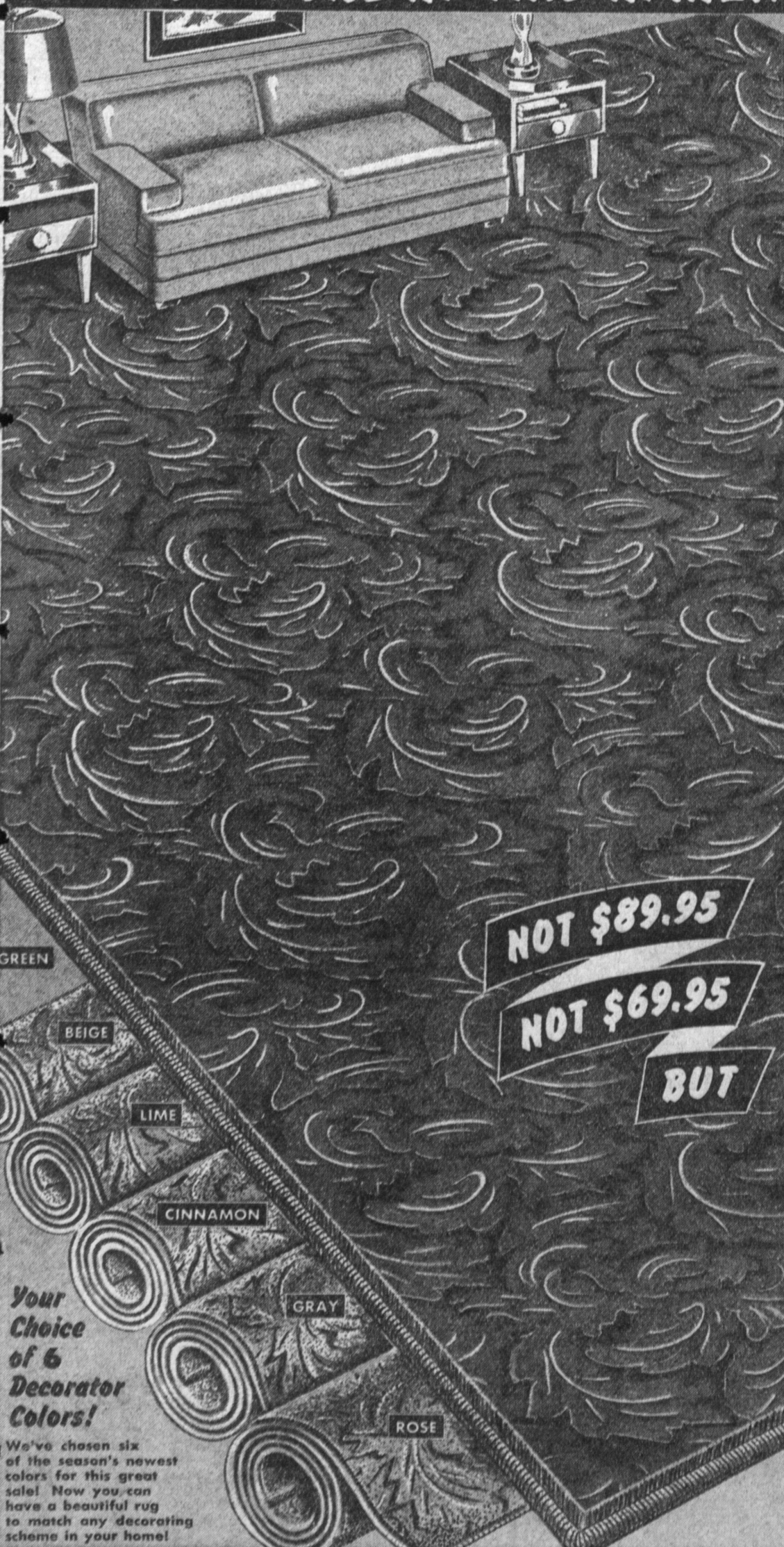

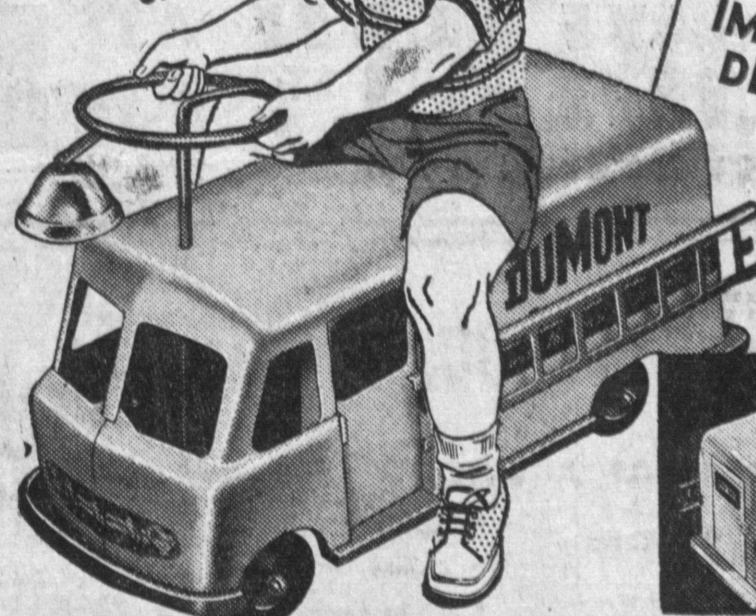

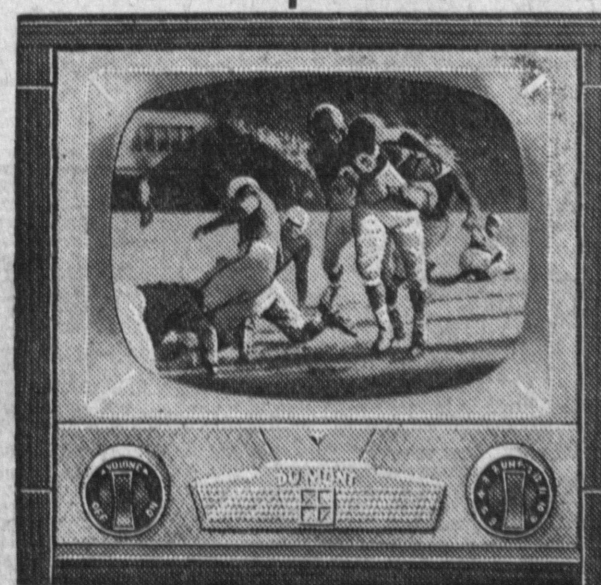
