Man Burned Trying To Save Dog

Efforts of M. A. Lemons, 37, of 1825 Pacific Coast highway to rescue his pet chihuahua from the flames proved futile and resulted in serious burns to himself Saturday morning.

Lemons was treated for first and second degree burns of the hands and face sustained when he rushed into his burning house.

Rescued by Lemons and firemen was one kitten and one chihuahua, while the other dog perished in the flames.

Two county fire department engine companies, directed by Capt. Robert Thomas, kept the flames from enveloping an adjoining appliance store, at 1821 Pacific Coast highway. Heavy damage resulted, however, when an automatic sprinkler system went off, drenching refrigerators and television sets.

Damage to the buildings was set at \$11,050.

Owner of the building was listed as John Hanna, Lomita.

Brad Marro, reputed by Carl Lertzman, director of Frankie Lane Enterprises, to have the greatest singing voice of our

time, will be another highlight of the program. Marro has appeared on the Larry Finley show, and also at the Manhattan Beach Fun Fair. He spent 3 years in the Navy, was a former swimming champion, and is a graduate of the University of Omaha.

Distinguished Soloist

Helena Sundgren, who possesses distinction of soloist for the United Nations, has appeared in many operatic roles in Stockholm, and other Scandinavian cities, as well as America. She sang the lead in the New York production of "Show Boat," and made her first TV appearance in Cleveland. She
