Dr. Warfield To Speak At Methodist

The First Methodist church of Torrance, El Prado and Manuel, will feature a special guest missionary speaker this Sunday evening, October 10, at 7:30 p.m. With a background of war experience in Europe, Dr. Warfield will speak at the third session of the School of Missions, sponsored by the Methodist church.

Since September 1952, Dr. Warfield has been director of the Overseas Relief, responsible for the raising and distribution of many thousands of dollars from Methodist churches for relief in Korea, India, and many other parts of the world.

His European experiences began in Poland in 1924, where he was stationed as a missionary. He was imprisoned by the Russians in 1939, and again by the Germans in 1941. He returned to this country with his family in 1942. In 1945 he was co-author with his wife of a book entitled "Call Us To Witness," a resume of their war experiences.
