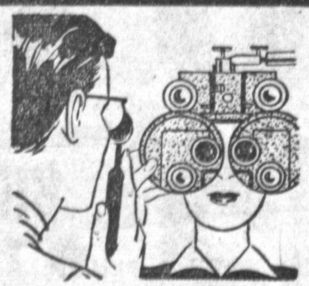

Ben Cluff Dairy Caps 100% Top Honors At County Fair

Ben Cluff, popular dairyman, of 22028 South Avalon
blvd., Torrance, recently capped four gold medals and
100% honors for entries of milk and cream in the Los An-
geles County Fair at Pomona. Out of four entries made by
the Ben Cluff Dairy, each of
the four was awarded a gold
medal (first prize).
The four samples consisted
of Grade A pasteurized milk,
homogenized milk, whipping
cream, and half-and-half. They
were awarded top honors on the

basis of low bacteria count,
flavor, odor, and butterfat con-
tent. Prizes were given accord-
ing to points earned.

The awards were made in the
dairy products department of
the Agricultural building in
which entries from all parts
of the state were shown. Sam-
ples were collected at random
by city and county health of-
ficers from stock on hand from
the competing distributors.

Presenting the awards were
Dr. Floyd Wilcox, William Whit-
ten and Gardner MacFarland of
the Los Angeles County Health
Department, and Lee Biggs and
Harold MacCausland of the
State Bureau of Dairy Service.

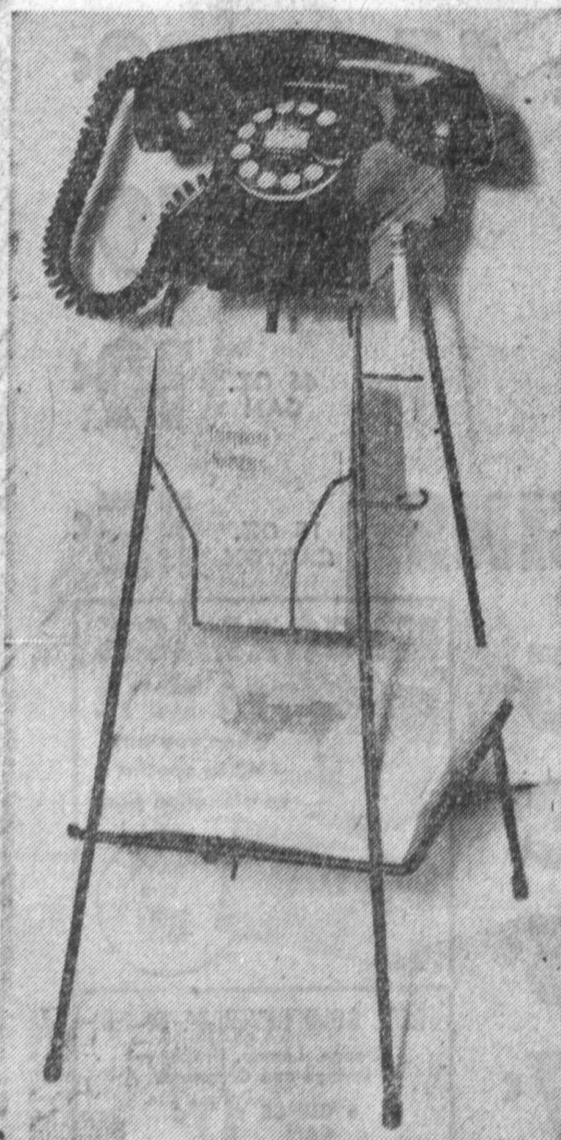

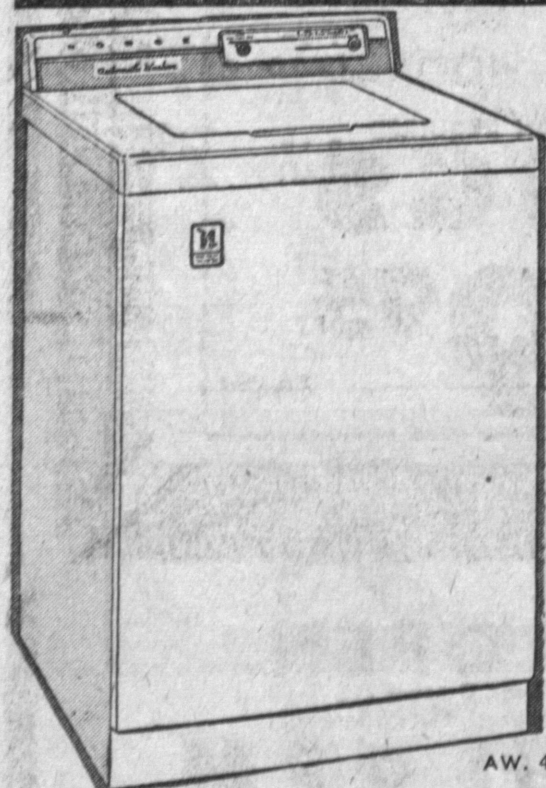

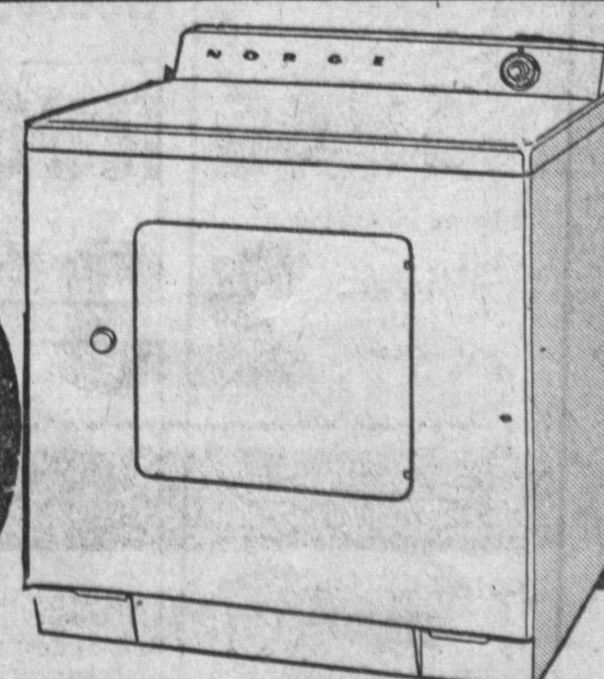
