Slips

Faircloth could only describe Young, a passing acquaintance, through an injury which Young received during the burglary. During his last trip across the fence, Young slipped and cut himself severely just under the lip. Faircloth said that Young wore a band-aid over the cut.

Bennett, Oaks, and Sgt. Ted Morris of the Torrance police spent a whole day combing the dives along Skid Row looking for Young. The band-aid wearing man was identified by the name "Richard" by one woman.

The detectives then searched police records for likely suspects by that name and showed the pictures to Young, who finally identified Faircloth.

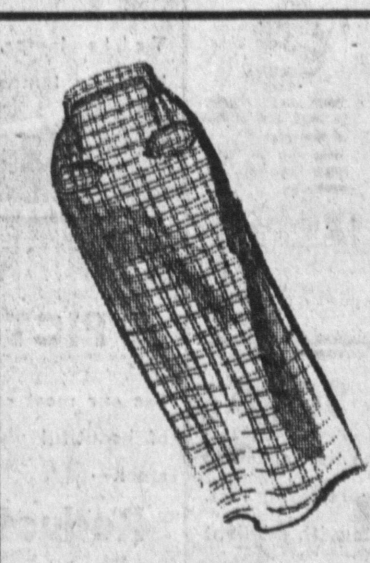
