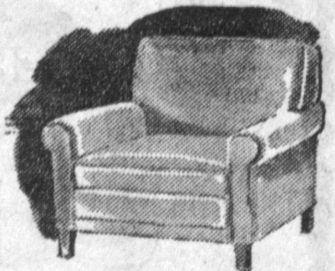

**CITY CHEST GOAL PLACED AT \$20,720**

This information, along with other data relative to the Harbor Area's 1954 Chest campaign, was revealed Community Chest volunteers in Torrance will shoot for a \$20,720 goal this fall.

Today in a statement of facts and figures submitted by City Chairman Mrs. Ella Schwartz. The report, based on the needs of the 164 Red Feather agencies, also disclosed that \$9347 of Torrance's goal will be raised by commerce and industry division volunteers.

**Harbor Goal**

The total amount of \$20,720 represents Torrance's quota of the overall \$83,179 goal of the Harbor Area Community Chest, which was announced this week by Tommy Thompson, Area campaign chairman.

Chest quotas in Torrance, the Harbor Area and elsewhere, were set by the volunteers, themselves, in a series of meetings held throughout the past year to determine the campaign potential of communities in the Los Angeles area and the needs of the 164 Chest agencies.

The Harbor Area goal of \$83,179 is divided as follows: Residential, advance gifts and small business, \$52,161; Tommy Thompson, chairman. Commerce and industry, \$31,018; Nick O. Dale, chairman.

A breakdown of Torrance's quota shows that \$11,343 will be raised through residential, advance gifts and small business under the direction of Mrs. Ella Schwartz, chairman. The remaining \$9347 of the local

quota will be solicited by commerce and industry members under the co-leadership of Warren W. Hamilton and Sam Levy.

**Other Harbor Cities**

Goals established for other cities in the Harbor Area are as follows:

San Pedro, \$28,466; Gardena, \$9965; Wilmington, \$12,770; Lomita and Harbor City, \$2970; Rolling Hills, \$2834; and Palos Verdes, \$7250.

The Area's goal of \$83,179 is part of the overall Los Angeles 1954 goal of \$8,652,000, which, according to Campaign Chairman Jack Fishburn, is \$300,000 more than what was raised during last year's campaign.

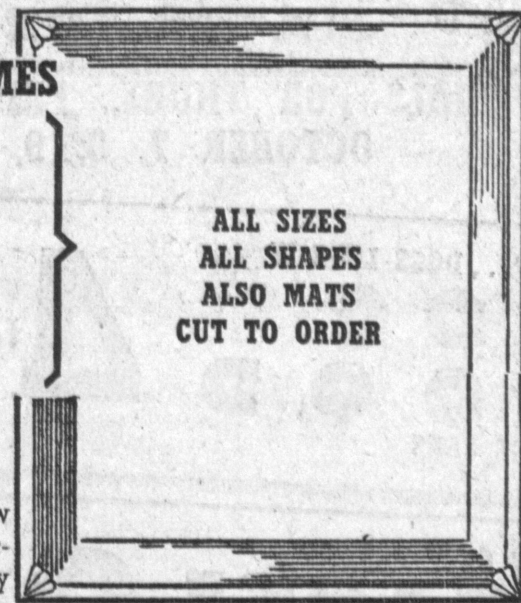
