Torrance Armory Here Soon Drive Starts To Recruit Men

Torrance will soon have a National Guard armory of its own. Stationed at the new armory will be the Bridge Company of the 132nd Combat Engineer Battalion of California's own 40th Armored Division.

Bridge Company, currently stationed at the Manhattan Beach Armory, is already primarily composed of men from Torrance and vicinity. Many of the men in the company have had no prior military experience.

Others come from such various backgrounds as for example Sfc. William R. Lyons, 101st Airborne Division, World War II; Sfc. Gordon T. Russell, 1st Marine Division, World War II and Korea; M/Sgt. John Garcia, 77th Inf. Division, World War II; M/Sgt. Ben Owens, 578th Combat Engineers, Korea, and many others.

Training Program

The unit meets one night a week for two hours and takes up such diversified training as: fundamentals of engineering layout and construction of bridges and roads, operation of engineer heavy equipment such as bulldozers, roadgraders, cranes; minefields and demolitions, and basic knowledge of the soldier and many individual special skills.

The highlight of the military year is the two weeks' summer camp where the year's training is put to test. Many advanced stages of training are taken up: weapons firing, military tactics and specialist training among others.

The National Guard provides the opportunity to train at home while fulfilling the draft requirements, it was stated.

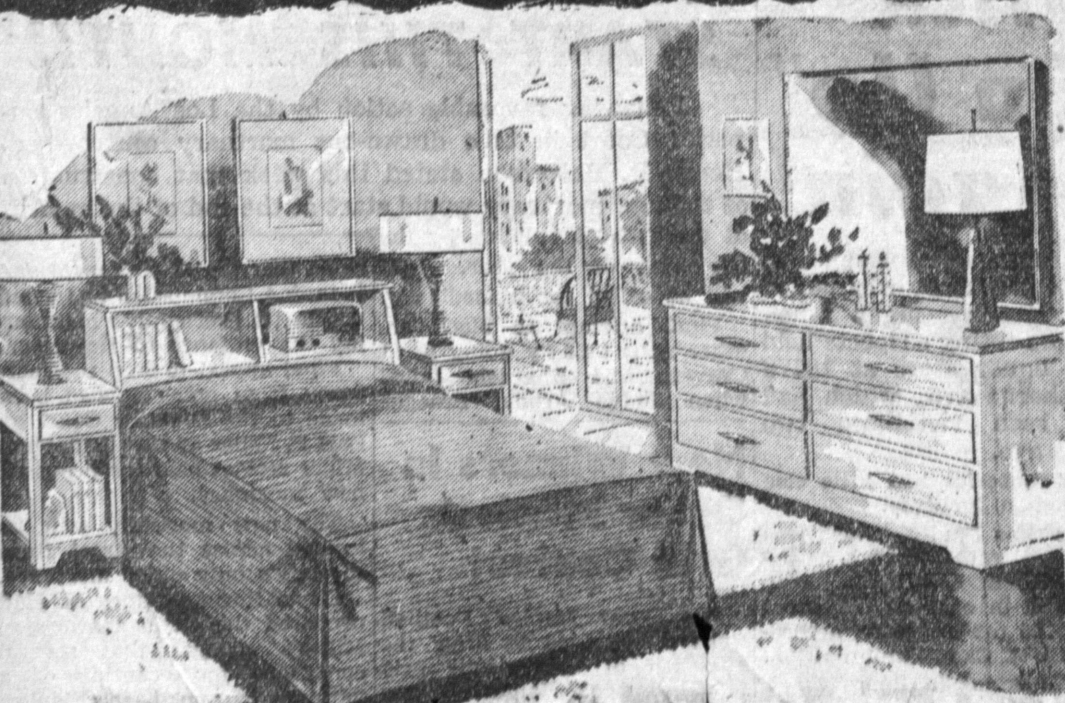
