Donald D. Robison, 39, principal of Evelyn Carr school, died suddenly of a heart attack last week Thursday at his home, 1307 Arlington ave.

"Mr. Robison was one of the key men in our organization," School Superintendent J. H. Hull said. "Before becoming principal of the Carr

school, he was principal of North Torrance. He has always been principal of one of our largest schools and has made a number of real contributions to Torrance schools during his five years here."

Robison opened both the

North Torrance and Carr schools.

A graduate of Whittier college, he received his master's degree from USC.

**Navy Veteran**  
The Navy veteran was born in Union Star, Missouri. He served three and a half years in the Navy during World War II, emerging as lieutenant junior grade.

Before coming to Torrance he had been a teacher in Baldwin Park and Alhambra.

Funeral services were held Saturday at Stone and Myers Chapel, with the Rev. John L. Taylor officiating.

## Chest Chairman Calls For 350 Volunteers

A call for 350 volunteers needed within the next week to round out Torrance's 1954-55 Community Chest campaign organization was issued today by Mrs. Ella Schwartz, city chairman, who asserted that "a complete well organized team" was the first step towards raising the local goal of \$20,720.

**Call For Volunteers**

In appealing to Torrance residents to join the Chest team, now 35 per cent organized, Mrs. Schwartz pointed out that little time remained in which to meet the 100 per cent enrollment deadline for Oct. 20 and asked prospective workers to contact her immediately.

To date, a total of 211 volunteers have enrolled in the residential, small business and advance gifts divisions, which will recruit \$11,373 of Torrance's

Next week's deadline for complete volunteer recruitment was set by Red Feather leaders in all the Harbor Area cities, in order that workers might be thoroughly organized and trained for action by Nov. 4, the campaign kick-off date. At that time, they will join 70,000 other volunteers from greater Los Angeles in helping to raise \$8,652,000 for the Chest's 164 health and welfare services. The Harbor's quota is \$83,179.

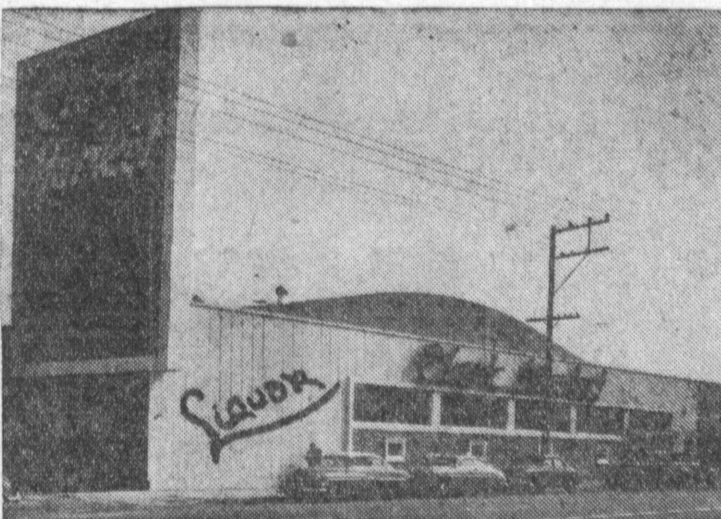
