Next Thursday, Nov. 4, the 30th annual appeal of the Los Angeles Community Chest will open.

And on the home front, a policy of "getting down to brass tacks" as a means of raising \$11,131 of Torrance's \$20,720 Red Feather goal will be carried out by over 500 volunteers organized under the direction of Mrs. Ella Schwartz, city chairman.

Kick-off

According to the pattern of campaign procedure set forth by Mrs. Schwartz at a kick-off instruction meeting attended by more than 30 campaign leaders, volunteers will assemble at the Torrance YWCA for a brief round-up meeting next Thursday morning. They will then form a television audience for the "Red Feather School House" to be shown over KTLA, Channel 5 at 10 a.m.

At the conclusion of the 15-minute drama, volunteers will then disperse and armed with the Chest's new "fair share plan" will set out to bid every family in Torrance to once more participate in the united way of giving to 164 Red Feather services.

Headquarters

The YWCA will serve as the central campaign headquarters from which workers will conduct their campaigning operations. Two other temporary campaign headquarters will be set up in El Retiro Park, Hollywood Riviera; and McMaster Hall, North Torrance.

Baby sitting headquarters set up to help volunteers devote the day to Red Feather solicitation activities, will be maintained by students of the home economics department at Torrance High School.

In seeking the cooperation of all residents necessary to assure

the ultimate success of the 1954 Chest campaign in Torrance, Mrs. Schwartz pointed out that the Chest through its 164 agencies helped a total of 1296 persons from Torrance, Lomita and Rolling Hills during the past year.

"Remember," she urged in conclusion, "the needs of these agencies are the needs of our own community. How we'll respond to their call for help reflects the interest we have in our community and in its welfare."
