## 'Voice of Democracy' Still Open to Student Contestants

Students in the tenth, eleventh and twelfth grades may still enter the Voice of Democracy contest being sponsored by the Torrance Junior Chamber of Commerce in conjunction with the National Association of Radio and Television Broadcasters, Radio Electronics Television Manufacturers Association and the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce.

Contestants are required to write and then voice, via recordings, five minute scripts on the subject, "I Speak for Democracy." Following community and state eliminations, a dozen finalists will be chosen from among the 52 state and territorial winners.

**National Awards Named**  
A panel of national judges will then select four co-equal national winners, each of whom receive a \$500 college scholarship, an all-expense trip to Washington, D. C., and Williamsburg, Va., next February and either a radio or television receiver.

Writing on the subject is the only requirement in Torrance. After the district winner is selected December 2 at the Junior Chamber district meet in El Segundo, a recording of that script will be made and sent on to state and national competition. In addition to the national awards, prizes will be given at the community level, and all state and territorial winners will receive either radio or television receivers.

According to Phil Lisman, local Jaycee chairman, the deadline to enter is November 1st.

The 30th birthday of Toastmasters International will be celebrated locally and throughout the land during the month of October, according to Area Governor Lincoln Schmidt, of Area 10, District One of Toastmasters International.

Schmidt explained that the local Toastmasters clubs will observe this important anniversary by participating in the Humorous and Liars Speech contests to be held today, October 28, at the Western Club in Gardena. Formal Speech Contest will be held next Spring.

**Local Speakers**  
Of the Torrance groups in the liars' contest, Gil Kyllingstad will represent the Torrance Toastmasters Evening Club while Bob Owens will represent the Midday Toastmasters.

In the humorous division, Frank Gorbett will speak for the Evening Club while Sy Frank will speak for the Midday Club. Schmidt stated that in 1924, Ralph C. Smedley, who happened to be a man of ideas, organized a club he called the Toastmasters. His idea was simply to improve public speaking.

Today, Dr. Smedley is witnessing the burgeoning of that idea into a great organization of approximately 1700 Toastmasters clubs, with some 50,000 members. It is now the fourth largest service club in number of clubs.

Assistant Secretary of the Army Charles C. Finucane, who this week spoke in the 17th Congressional District in behalf of nominee Bob Finch and the

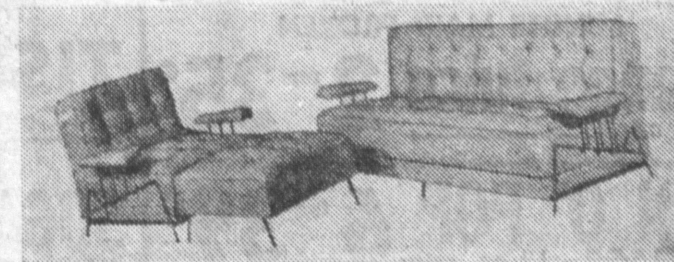
