

Church Women in World Observance

World Community Day on November 5, will be observed in Torrance by the Council of United Church Women at the Central Evangelical United Brethren Church, 1543 Marcelina avenue.

Mrs. Arthur G. Solomon, president of the Torrance Council, will preside at a 10 a.m. business session, followed by a sack lunch at 11:45 a.m.

Women from many Torrance churches will meet at 1 p.m. to hear Mrs. John L. Taylor tell her impressions of the gigantic gathering at the World Council of Churches which was held in Evanston, Illinois, during August. Mrs. Taylor, with her husband, who is pastor of Torrance Methodist Church, spent a week at Evanston during the convocation.

Highlight of the local observance will be gathering of children's clothing, blankets, household linens, yarns and cloth. These will be sent to tiny refugees in orphanages from Korea to Berlin. Arab children displaced from Israel; Chinese tots sheltered in Hong Kong; and refugee mothers anxious to make garments but lacking the material to do so.
